- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing pilot programs to plan for the 2 needs of certain college students experiencing homelessness; adding a
- 3 new section to chapter 28B.50 RCW; adding a new section to chapter
- 4 28B.77 RCW; and providing expiration dates.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 7 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The college board must establish a pilot program to encourage

- 9 college districts to plan for the unique needs and challenges of 10 students experiencing homelessness. Such accommodations may include, 11 but are not limited to: Laundry facilities, storage, showers,
- 12 encouraging culinary programs to provide free or reduced-price meals,
- and providing short-term housing or housing assistance; and plans to
- 14 develop surplus property for affordable housing to accommodate the
- 15 needs of students experiencing homelessness. The pilot program must
- 16 include four college districts, two on each side of the Cascade
- mountain range. The pilot program expires July 1, 2023. The college districts that participate in the pilot program must provide a joint
- 19 report to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December
- 20 1, 2023, that includes at least the following information: The number
- 21 of students experiencing homelessness during the pilot program, the

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- number of students assisted, strategies for accommodating students experiencing homelessness, and legislative recommendations.
 - (2) "Homelessness" means without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence as set forth in the federal McKinney-Vento homeless assistance act, P.L. 100-77, July 22, 1987, 101 Stat. 482, and runaway and homeless youth act, P.L. 93-415, Title III, September 7, 1974, 88 Stat. 1129.
- 8 (3) This section expires January 1, 2024.

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- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.77 10 RCW to read as follows:
- 11 (1) The council must establish a pilot program to encourage fouryear institutions of higher education to plan for the unique needs 12 13 and challenges of students experiencing homelessness. accommodations may include, but are not limited to: Laundry 14 15 facilities, storage, showers, encouraging culinary programs 16 provide free or reduced-price meals, and providing short-term housing 17 or housing assistance; and plans to develop surplus property for 18 affordable housing to accommodate the needs of students experiencing 19 homelessness. The pilot program must include two four-year 20 institutions of higher education, one on each side of the Cascade mountain range. The pilot program expires July 1, 2023. The four-year 21 institutions of higher education that participate in the pilot 22 23 program must provide a joint report to the appropriate committees of 24 the legislature by December 1, 2023, that includes at least the following information: The number of 25 students experiencing 26 homelessness during the pilot program, the number of students 27 assisted, strategies for accommodating students experiencing homelessness, and legislative recommendations. 28
- 29 (2) "Homelessness" means without a fixed, regular, and adequate 30 nighttime residence as set forth in the federal McKinney-Vento 31 homeless assistance act, P.L. 100-77, July 22, 1987, 101 Stat. 482, 32 and runaway and homeless youth act, P.L. 93-415, Title III, September 33 7, 1974, 88 Stat. 1129.
- 34 (3) This section expires January 1, 2024.

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
