1 AN ACT Relating to creating Washington state aviation special
2 license plates; reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and
3 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and creating a
4 new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the aviation
7 industry and community airports are an integral part of Washington's
8 economy. Washington state is home to public use airports serving an
9 average of eighteen thousand five hundred pilots and over nine
10 thousand aircraft annually. They support two hundred forty-eight
11 thousand five hundred jobs and more than fifty billion dollars in
12 economic activity. Aviators play a vital role in our state's response
13 to emergencies and natural disasters. Therefore, the legislature
14 intends with this act to create the Washington state aviation license
15 plate to honor and support the aviation community.

16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2016 c 36 s 1, 2016 c 30 s 1, 2016 c
17 16 s 1, and 2016 c 15 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as
18 follows:

19 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
20 department:

1 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
2 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
3 plates unless otherwise specified;

4 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
5 department;

6 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
7 46.87 RCW; and

8 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

9 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
10 license plates:

LICENSE PLATE	DESCRIPTION, SYMBOL, OR ARTWORK
4-H	Displays the "4-H" logo.
Armed forces collection	Recognizes the contribution of veterans, active duty military personnel, reservists, and members of the national guard, and includes six separate designs, each containing a symbol representing a different branch of the armed forces to include army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard, and national guard.
Breast cancer awareness	Displays a pink ribbon symbolizing breast cancer awareness.
Endangered wildlife	Displays a symbol or artwork symbolizing endangered wildlife in Washington state.
Gonzaga University alumni association	Recognizes the Gonzaga University alumni association.
Helping kids speak	Recognizes an organization that supports programs that provide no-cost speech pathology programs to children.
Keep kids safe	Recognizes efforts to prevent child abuse and neglect.

1 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
2 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
3 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
4 state council of firefighters.

5 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
6 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
7 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
8 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
9 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
10 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
11 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
12 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
13 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
14 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
15 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
16 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
17 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
18 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
19 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
20 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
21 surrendered upon conviction.

22 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c
23 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and
24 amended to read as follows:

25 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
26 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
27 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
28 license plate fee as listed in this section.

12 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for
13 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds
14 must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the
15 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to
16 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including
17 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being
18 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer
19 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

20 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2016 c 36 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 3, and 2016
21 c 15 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

22 (1) The department shall:

23 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
24 46.17.220;

25 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
26 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
27 collection expenses incurred by it; and

28 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
29 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

30 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
31 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has
32 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license
33 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been
34 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
35 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the
36 following appropriate account as created in this section in the
37 custody of the state treasurer:

9 courts. Funds for construction
10 must first be made available to the
11 most populous eligible city,
12 according to the most recent
13 census, for a time period not to
14 exceed five years after January 1,
15 2017. After the five-year time
16 period, the funds for construction
17 must be made available to the
18 next most populous eligible city.
19 Funds for the maintenance of a
20 public tennis facility with at least
21 four indoor tennis courts must
22 first be made available to the first
23 eligible city that utilizes funds for
24 construction provided by chapter
25 16, Laws of 2016.
