AN ACT Relating to the crime of voyeurism; amending RCW 9A.44.115 and 13.40.070; reenacting and amending RCW 9.94A.515; and prescribing penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 9A.44.115 and 2003 c 213 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) As used in this section:

8 (a) "Intimate areas" means any portion of a person's body or 9 undergarments that is covered by clothing and intended to be 10 protected from public view;

(b) "Photographs" or "films" means the making of a photograph, motion picture film, videotape, digital image, or any other recording or transmission of the image of a person;

14 (c) "Place where he or she would have a reasonable expectation of 15 privacy" means:

(i) A place where a reasonable person would believe that he or
she could disrobe in privacy, without being concerned that his or her
undressing was being photographed or filmed by another; or

(ii) A place where one may reasonably expect to be safe fromcasual or hostile intrusion or surveillance;

1 (d) "Surveillance" means secret observation of the activities of 2 another person for the purpose of spying upon and invading the 3 privacy of the person;

4 (e) "Views" means the intentional looking upon of another person 5 for more than a brief period of time, in other than a casual or 6 cursory manner, with the unaided eye or with a device designed or 7 intended to improve visual acuity.

8 (2)(a) A person commits the crime of voyeurism <u>in the first</u> 9 <u>degree</u> if, for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the sexual 10 desire of any person, he or she knowingly views, photographs, or 11 films:

12 (((a))) (i) Another person without that person's knowledge and 13 consent while the person being viewed, photographed, or filmed is in 14 a place where he or she would have a reasonable expectation of 15 privacy; or

16 (((b))) (ii) The intimate areas of another person without that 17 person's knowledge and consent and under circumstances where the 18 person has a reasonable expectation of privacy, whether in a public 19 or private place.

20

(((3))) <u>(b)</u> Voyeurism <u>in the first degree</u> is a class C felony.

21 (3)(a) A person commits the crime of voyeurism in the second 22 degree if he or she intentionally photographs or films another person 23 for the purpose of photographing or filming the intimate areas of 24 that person with the intent to distribute or disseminate the 25 photograph or film, without that person's knowledge and consent, and 26 under circumstances where the person has a reasonable expectation of 27 privacy, whether in a public or private place.

(b) Voyeurism in the second degree is a gross misdemeanor.

29 (c) Voyeurism in the second degree is not a sex offense for the 30 purposes of sentencing or sex offender registration requirements 31 under this chapter.

(4) This section does not apply to viewing, photographing, or filming by personnel of the department of corrections or of a local jail or correctional facility for security purposes or during investigation of alleged misconduct by a person in the custody of the department of corrections or the local jail or correctional facility.

37 (5) If a person is convicted of a violation of this section, the 38 court may order the destruction of any photograph, motion picture 39 film, digital image, videotape, or any other recording of an image 40 that was made by the person in violation of this section. 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 13.40.070 and 2013 c 179 s 3 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

3 (1) Complaints referred to the juvenile court alleging the 4 commission of an offense shall be referred directly to the 5 prosecutor. The prosecutor, upon receipt of a complaint, shall screen 6 the complaint to determine whether:

7 (a) The alleged facts bring the case within the jurisdiction of8 the court; and

9 (b) On a basis of available evidence there is probable cause to 10 believe that the juvenile did commit the offense.

11 (2) If the identical alleged acts constitute an offense under 12 both the law of this state and an ordinance of any city or county of 13 this state, state law shall govern the prosecutor's screening and 14 charging decision for both filed and diverted cases.

(3) If the requirements of subsections (1)(a) and (b) of this 15 16 section are met, the prosecutor shall either file an information in 17 juvenile court or divert the case, as set forth in subsections (5), (6), and (8) of this section. If the prosecutor finds that the 18 requirements of subsection (1)(a) and (b) of this section are not 19 met, the prosecutor shall maintain a record, for one year, of such 20 21 decision and the reasons therefor. In lieu of filing an information or diverting an offense a prosecutor may file a motion to modify 22 community supervision where such offense constitutes a violation of 23 24 community supervision.

(4) An information shall be a plain, concise, and definite written statement of the essential facts constituting the offense charged. It shall be signed by the prosecuting attorney and conform to chapter 10.37 RCW.

(5) Except as provided in RCW 13.40.213 and subsection (7) of this section, where a case is legally sufficient, the prosecutor shall file an information with the juvenile court if:

(a) An alleged offender is accused of a class A felony, a class B
felony, an attempt to commit a class B felony, a class C felony
listed in RCW 9.94A.411(2) as a crime against persons or listed in
RCW 9A.46.060 as a crime of harassment, or a class C felony that is a
violation of RCW 9.41.080 or 9.41.040(2)(a)(((iii))) (iv); or

37 (b) An alleged offender is accused of a felony and has a criminal 38 history of any felony, or at least two gross misdemeanors, or at 39 least two misdemeanors; or

1 (c) An alleged offender has previously been committed to the 2 department; or

3 (d) An alleged offender has been referred by a diversion unit for
4 prosecution or desires prosecution instead of diversion; or

5 (e) An alleged offender has three or more diversion agreements on
6 the alleged offender's criminal history; or

7 (f) A special allegation has been filed that the offender or an 8 accomplice was armed with a firearm when the offense was committed.

9 (6) Where a case is legally sufficient the prosecutor shall 10 divert the case if the alleged offense is a misdemeanor or gross 11 misdemeanor or violation and the alleged offense is the offender's 12 first offense or violation. If the alleged offender is charged with a 13 related offense that must or may be filed under subsections (5) and 14 (8) of this section, a case under this subsection may also be filed.

15 (7) Where a case is legally sufficient to charge an alleged 16 offender with:

17 <u>(a) Either prostitution or prostitution loitering and the alleged</u> 18 offense is the offender's first prostitution or prostitution 19 loitering offense, the prosecutor shall divert the case; or

20 (b) Voyeurism in the second degree, the offender is under 21 seventeen years of age, and the alleged offense is the offender's 22 first voyeurism in the second degree offense, the prosecutor shall 23 divert the case, unless the offender has received two diversions for 24 any offense in the previous two years.

(8) Where a case is legally sufficient and falls into neither subsection (5) nor (6) of this section, it may be filed or diverted. In deciding whether to file or divert an offense under this section the prosecutor shall be guided only by the length, seriousness, and recency of the alleged offender's criminal history and the circumstances surrounding the commission of the alleged offense.

31 (9) Whenever a juvenile is placed in custody or, where not placed in custody, referred to a diversion interview, the parent or legal 32 quardian of the juvenile shall be notified as soon as possible 33 concerning the allegation made against the juvenile and the current 34 status of the juvenile. Where a case involves victims of crimes 35 36 against persons or victims whose property has not been recovered at the time a juvenile is referred to a diversion unit, the victim shall 37 be notified of the referral and informed how to contact the unit. 38

(10) The responsibilities of the prosecutor under subsections (1)through (9) of this section may be performed by a juvenile court

1 probation counselor for any complaint referred to the court alleging 2 the commission of an offense which would not be a felony if committed 3 by an adult, if the prosecutor has given sufficient written notice to 4 the juvenile court that the prosecutor will not review such 5 complaints.

6 (11) The prosecutor, juvenile court probation counselor, or 7 diversion unit may, in exercising their authority under this section 8 or RCW 13.40.080, refer juveniles to mediation or victim offender 9 reconciliation programs. Such mediation or victim offender 10 reconciliation programs shall be voluntary for victims.
