- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the aviation
- 7 industry and community airports are an integral part of Washington's
- 8 economy. Washington state is home to public use airports serving an
- 9 average of eighteen thousand five hundred pilots and over nine
- 10 thousand aircraft annually. They support two hundred forty-eight
- 11 thousand five hundred jobs and more than fifty billion dollars in
- 12 economic activity. Aviators play a vital role in our state's response
- 13 to emergencies and natural disasters. Therefore, the legislature
- 14 intends with this act to create the Washington state aviation license
- 15 plate to honor and support the aviation community.

(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state council of firefighters.

- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 5 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten 6 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) 7 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate 8 9 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting 10 service before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the 11 12 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer 13 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, 14 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 15 16 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 17 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their 18 19 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be 20 surrendered upon conviction. 21
- 22 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c 23 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and 24 amended to read as follows:
  - (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.
- **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2016 c 36 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 3, and 2016 c 15 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The department shall:

- 23 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 24 46.17.220;
- 25 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial 26 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and 27 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 28 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state 29 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
  - (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody of the state treasurer:

- 7 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize 8 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this 9 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under 10 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.
  - (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.
- 18 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 20 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 21 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization 22 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW to read as follows:
- "Washington state aviation license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display images of a Stearman biplane and Mount Rainier.
