- AN ACT Relating to eliminating the requirement that a city or town provide preservation rating information on a certain percentage of its arterial network; and amending RCW 46.68.113.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.68.113 and 2013 c 306 s 704 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, cities and towns shall provide to the transportation commission, or its successor entity, 8 preservation rating information on at least seventy percent of the 9 10 total city and town arterial network. Thereafter, the preservation 11 rating information requirement shall increase in increments in subsequent biennia, but in no case shall it exceed 12 eighty percent. The rating system used by cities and towns must be 13 14 based upon the Washington state pavement rating method equivalent standard approved by the department of transportation. 15 16 Beginning January 1, 2007, the preservation rating information shall 17 be submitted to the department.
- (2) ((Cities and towns are exempt from the requirement to report preservation rating information to the department or the transportation commission through the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium.))
 The requirement that cities and towns report preservation rating

- information to the department of transportation or the transportation commission under subsection (1) of this section is eliminated during the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium.
- (3) The department of transportation shall, in consultation with 4 cities, towns, and the transportation commission, review the pavement 5 6 preservation rating reporting requirements and recommend to the legislature whether a repeal of the pavement preservation rating 7 report is warranted. In its analysis, the department shall determine 8 (a) what pavement preservation rating information exists through 9 other reporting requirements and how the department's migration 10 toward an asset management accountability framework affects the 11 pavement preservation rating report, and (b) whether such other 12 reporting requirements will serve as a replacement, or an addition, 13 to the report. The department must report its findings to the 14 15 legislature by December 1, 2017.
