1 AN ACT Relating to a systemwide credit policy regarding AP exams;
2 adding a new section to chapter 28B.10 RCW; and creating a new
3 section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that advanced
6 placement coursework prepares students for postsecondary success and
7 provides opportunities for them to earn college credit or secure
8 placement in advanced courses. The legislature further finds that
9 eighty-four thousand eight hundred sixty-six students took an AP exam
10 in Washington state in 2015. The legislature further finds that six
11 thousand six hundred sixty-seven of those students were
12 underrepresented minority students and nine thousand four hundred
13 seventy-one were low-income students. The legislature further finds
14 that of the students that took an AP exam in Washington state in
15 2015, fifty-one thousand seven hundred twenty-five scored a three,
16 four, or five.

17 Therefore, the legislature intends to establish a policy for
18 granting as many undergraduate course credits as possible to students
19 who have earned a minimum score of three on their AP exams and
20 clearly communicate credit awarding policies and course equivalencies
21 to students. The goal of the policy is to award course credit in all

1 appropriate instances and maximize the number of college students
2 given college credit for AP exam scores of three or higher.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) The institutions of higher education must establish a
6 coordinated, evidence-based policy for granting as many undergraduate
7 college credits to students who have earned minimum scores of three
8 on AP exams as possible and appropriate.

9 (2) Credit policy regarding all AP exams must be posted on campus
10 web sites effective for the 2017 fall academic term. The institutions
11 of higher education must conduct biennial reviews of their AP credit
12 policy and report noncompliance to the appropriate committees of the
13 legislature by November 1st each year beginning November 1, 2019.
