AN ACT Relating to creating Patches pal special license plates; reenacting and amending RCW 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 46.17.220 and 2019 c 384 s 2 and 2019 c 177 s 2 are 7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 9 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the 10 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special 11 license plate fee as listed in this section.

(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
state council of firefighters.

(4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 5 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten 6 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) 7 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate 8 9 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting 10 service before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the 11 12 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, 13 14 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 15 16 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 17 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their 18 19 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be 20 21 surrendered upon conviction.

22 Sec. 3. RCW 46.68.420 and 2019 c 384 s 3 and 2019 c 177 s 3 are 23 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

24 (1) The department shall:

25 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 26 46.17.220;

(b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and collection expenses incurred by it; and

30 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state 31 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

32 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor 33 vehicle ((account [fund])) <u>fund</u> until the department determines that 34 the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the 35 special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the 36 state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the 37 remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license

7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the 8 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from 9 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The 10 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, 11 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

12 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the 13 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this 14 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in this section and under contract between 15 subsection (2) of the 16 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the 17 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

18 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to 19 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the 20 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the 21 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety 22 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

(7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 35 RCW to read as follows:

36 "Patches pal license plates" means special license plates issued 37 under RCW 46.18.200 that display the likenesses of the J.P. Patches 38 and Gertrude characters from the J.P. Patches show.
