- AN ACT Relating to creating Washington state women veterans special license plates; reenacting and amending RCW 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
- 3 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
- 4 creating a new section; and providing an effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. Washington is home to approximately fifty-7 eight thousand women veterans and women comprise ten percent of the nation's veteran population. Women have served through all periods of 8 United States history, whether fighting in disguise or as spies 9 during the American Revolution and Civil War; as nurses, 10 drivers, intelligence analysts, and airplane mechanics in World War 11 12 II; or as helicopter pilots in combat zones in Afghanistan and Iraq. 13 Today approximately ten thousand five hundred women are on active 14 duty in Washington state, and women are the fastest growing segment of the veteran population, with one million nine hundred thousand 15 16 women veterans representing every branch of the military living 17 nationwide, a number that is expected to increase over the next ten years. To honor the sacrifice and contributions of women veterans to 18 our country, recognize their unique life experiences, and raise 19 greater awareness of the need for services and support for women 20

veterans, the legislature hereby creates the women veterans special license plate.

Sec. 2. RCW 46.17.220 and 2019 c 384 s 2 and 2019 c 177 s 2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- 4 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters 5 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility 6 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington 7 state council of firefighters.
- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 8 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten 9 10 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) 11 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting 12 13 service before ten years of service have been completed, volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the 14 15 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer 16 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, 17 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 18 19 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying 20 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 21 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their 22 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a 23 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be 24 surrendered upon conviction.
- 25 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2019 c 384 s 3 and 2019 c 177 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The department shall:

- 28 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 29 46.17.220;
  - (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and collection expenses incurred by it; and
  - (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
  - (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle ((account [fund])) <u>fund</u> until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the

- (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.
- (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.
- (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.
- (6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.
- (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

- "Women veterans special license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a symbol or artwork recognizing the efforts of women veterans in Washington state.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act takes effect July 1, 2020.
