1 AN ACT Relating to expanding access to building trades 2 apprenticeships; adding a new section to chapter 49.04 RCW; and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the demand for 5 NEW SECTION. 6 skilled workers in the construction trades is expected to increase 7 over the next decade. In Snohomish county alone, workforce Snohomish estimates an increase of two thousand two hundred jobs. However, the 8 9 average age of a building trades apprentice is in the late twenties, lost decade of productivity. Therefore, 10 representing a the 11 legislature recognizes the need to develop clear, seamless education pathways into careers in the building trades for high school students 12 13 and adult learners. The legislature intends to support this need by 14 establishing a dual credit apprenticeship preparation program that 15 will prepare participants for entry into a registered apprenticeship 16 program in the building trades.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 49.04 18 RCW to read as follows:

1 districts, local labor unions, and local industry groups to develop 2 the regional apprenticeship pathways program.

3 (2) The regional apprenticeship pathways program must establish 4 an education-based apprenticeship preparation program recognized by 5 the Washington state apprenticeship and training council that 6 prepares individuals for registered apprenticeships within the 7 building trades.

8 (3) The apprenticeship preparation program must provide dual 9 credit for participants by meeting high school graduation 10 requirements and providing opportunities for credit leading to a 11 college credential. In addition, the apprenticeship preparation 12 program must provide participants with preferred or direct entry into 13 a registered apprenticeship program in the building trades.
