Read first time 01/24/19. Referred to Committee on College & Workforce Development.

1 AN ACT Relating to the helping homeless college students act;  
2 adding a new section to chapter 28B.50 RCW; adding a new section to  
3 chapter 28B.77 RCW; and providing expiration dates.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50  
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) The college board shall select four college districts, two on  
8 each side of the crest of the Cascade mountain range, to participate  
9 in a pilot program to provide assistance to students experiencing  
10 homelessness and to students who were in the foster care system when  
11 they graduated high school. The college districts chosen to  
12 participate in the pilot program must provide certain accommodations  
13 to these students that may include, but are not limited to, the  
14 following:

15 (a) Access to laundry facilities;

16 (b) Access to storage;

17 (c) Access to locker room and shower facilities;

18 (d) Reduced-price meals or meal plans, and access to food banks;

19 (e) Access to technology;

20 (f) Access to short-term housing or housing assistance,  
21 especially during seasonal breaks; and

1 (g) Case management services.

2 (2) The college districts may also establish plans to develop  
3 surplus property for affordable housing to accommodate the needs of  
4 students experiencing homelessness and students who were in the  
5 foster care system when they graduated high school.

6 (3) The college districts participating in the pilot program  
7 shall provide a joint report to the appropriate committees of the  
8 legislature by December 1, 2023, that includes at least the following  
9 information:

10 (a) The number of students experiencing homelessness and the  
11 number of students who were in the foster care system when they  
12 graduated high school who were attending a community or technical  
13 college during the pilot program. The college board shall coordinate  
14 with all of the community and technical colleges to collect voluntary  
15 data on how many students experiencing homelessness are attending the  
16 community and technical colleges;

17 (b) The number of students assisted by the pilot program;

18 (c) Strategies for accommodating students experiencing  
19 homelessness and former foster care students; and

20 (d) Legislative recommendations for how students experiencing  
21 homelessness and former foster care students could be better served.

22 (4) The pilot program expires July 1, 2023.

23 (5) This section expires January 1, 2024.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.77  
25 RCW to read as follows:

26 (1) The council shall select two public four-year institutions of  
27 higher education, one on each side of the crest of the Cascade  
28 mountain range, to participate in a pilot program to provide  
29 assistance to students experiencing homelessness and to students who  
30 were in the foster care system when they graduated high school. The  
31 four-year institutions of higher education chosen to participate in  
32 the pilot program must provide certain accommodations to these  
33 students that may include, but are not limited to, the following:

34 (a) Access to laundry facilities;

35 (b) Access to storage;

36 (c) Access to locker room and shower facilities;

37 (d) Reduced-price meals or meal plans, and access to food banks;

38 (e) Access to technology;

1 (f) Access to short-term housing or housing assistance,  
2 especially during seasonal breaks; and

3 (g) Case management services.

4 (2) The four-year institutions of higher education may also  
5 establish plans to develop surplus property for affordable housing to  
6 accommodate the needs of students experiencing homelessness and  
7 students who were in the foster care system when they graduated high  
8 school.

9 (3) The four-year institutions of higher education participating  
10 in the pilot program shall provide a joint report to the appropriate  
11 committees of the legislature by December 1, 2023, that includes at  
12 least the following information:

13 (a) The number of students experiencing homelessness and the  
14 number of students who were in the foster care system when they  
15 graduated high school who were attending a four-year institution of  
16 higher education during the pilot program. The council shall  
17 coordinate with all of the four-year institutions of higher education  
18 to collect voluntary data on how many students experiencing  
19 homelessness are attending the four-year institutions of higher  
20 education;

21 (b) The number of students assisted by the pilot program;

22 (c) Strategies for accommodating students experiencing  
23 homelessness and former foster care students; and

24 (d) Legislative recommendations for how students experiencing  
25 homelessness and former foster care students could be better served.

26 (4) The pilot program expires July 1, 2023.

27 (5) This section expires January 1, 2024.
