HOUSE BILL 1853

State of Washington 66th Legislature 2019 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to the development and coordination of a statewide don't drip and drive program; adding a new chapter to Title A6 RCW; making appropriations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1)(a) The legislature finds, regarding 7 the don't drip and drive program undertaken by the department of 8 ecology between 2011 and 2017, that the program:

9 (i) Was designed to improve vehicle owners' awareness of vehicle 10 leaks and to motivate the owners of leaking vehicles to fix the 11 leaks;

(ii) Has achieved progress in addressing a significant source of
water pollution in the Puget Sound region: Vehicles that leak fluids
that cause significant water quality impairments;

(iii) Was developed in partnership with an extensive coalition of municipalities and other partners in the Puget Sound region;

17 (iv) Was founded on extensive research and a well developed 18 educational campaign;

19 (v) Has been funded by a series of one-time grants; and

20 (vi) Has resulted in the reduction of the source of water 21 pollution from vehicle fluids, as well as a number of ancillary

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benefits, including improved vehicle fuel economy for vehicle owners, better air quality, the delayed need for vehicle repairs, improved reliability in vehicle operation, and others;

4 (b) The legislature further finds that the results of the program 5 demonstrate benefits that could be realized: More comprehensively, 6 were the scope of the program to emphasize all benefits of proper 7 vehicle maintenance; more broadly, were the program to be expanded 8 statewide; and continuously, were the program to be funded with a 9 permanent revenue source;

10 (c) The legislature further finds that the benefits of proper 11 vehicle maintenance are more pronounced in older vehicles; and

12 (d) The legislature also recognizes the value of partnerships 13 with local governments and private sector stakeholders in ensuring 14 the development and establishment of a robust and enduring program.

(2) The legislature finds that an ongoing and statewide vehicle 15 16 maintenance improvement program to sustain and expand on the progress under the don't drip and drive program is appropriate and necessary. 17 Such a program must be based on proper groundwork in the form of a 18 carefully developed implementation plan. The legislature therefore 19 intends to initiate such development by directing the stormwater 20 21 center at Washington State University to guide the formulation of the 22 plan, in collaboration with local partners and affected stakeholders.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The Washington stormwater center of the 24 Washington State University shall develop and coordinate a statewide 25 don't drip and drive program.

(1) The program's mission is to use behavior change strategies to prevent stormwater pollution from leaking motor vehicles, to help drivers properly maintain vehicles, and to help local jurisdictions meet national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES) requirements.

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(2) The program must be based on the following principles:

(a) The program must utilize local partnerships. The program
should partner with local jurisdictions and other public, private,
and nonprofit businesses and organizations, including tribal and
regional organizations as appropriate, to promote the voluntary
program and assist with program implementation.

37 (b) The program should use messaging designed to motivate vehicle38 owners to identify and repair leaks in their vehicles.

1 (c) The program should make use of incentives as needed to ensure 2 success, to the extent that funding or resources is provided for such 3 purposes.

4 (d) The program should take steps to address environmental 5 justice and equity issues, such as through outreach to low-income 6 vehicle owners, to vehicle owners who speak languages other than 7 English, and to those who may not be available to participate in the 8 program during normal business hours.

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(3) With respect to the scope of the program:

10 (a) The program should be expanded to all areas of Washington 11 state. Any local jurisdiction should have the opportunity to 12 participate, but should not be required to do so.

13 (b) The program materials and tool kits should be available and 14 generalized enough to be adaptable to any jurisdiction.

15 (c) The program should provide technical assistance to local 16 jurisdictions to assist in developing partnerships, offering 17 workshops, and promoting the program.

18 (d) The program should provide for: Adequate marketing and 19 advertising; public events and workshops; and partnerships with 20 commercial and nonprofit organizations.

(e) The program should include outreach to businesses and ownersof fleet vehicles.

23 (f) The program should utilize an array of media types with 24 accessible communications and various languages.

25 (g) The program should account for differences in regional needs 26 and not employ a one size-fits-all approach.

27 (4) In administering the program, the stormwater center may 28 leverage expertise by contracting with nonprofit or for profit trade associations of vehicle repair professionals. The stormwater center 29 should work closely with a statewide steering committee with 30 31 representatives of: The departments of commerce, ecology, and 32 transportation; local governments holding municipal stormwater permits; local governments that have previously provided oversight 33 for the don't drip and drive program funded at the department of 34 ecology; environmental and environmental justice stakeholders; trade 35 schools and community colleges; and other regional partnerships, with 36 neighboring states or British Columbia, as appropriate. 37

(5) The program should be designed with goals and objectives and include performance measures to track progress. The program should include regular reporting to the governor and legislature. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1)(a) The sum of three hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal biennium ending June 30, 2021, from the motor vehicle fund to Washington State University for the purposes of developing a plan for the implementation of a statewide don't drip and drive program. The plan should be based on the provisions in section 2 of this act and should include a detailed budget proposal.

8 (b) By September 1, 2020, the university shall submit a copy of 9 the plan to the governor and the appropriate standing committees of 10 the legislature.

11 (2) The sum of three hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof 12 as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal biennium ending 13 June 30, 2021, from the motor vehicle fund to the department of 14 commerce for grants to extend the existing don't drip and drive 15 program through June 30, 2021.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act constitute a 17 new chapter in Title 46 RCW.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 2019.

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
