1 AN ACT Relating to standardizing fire safety requirements for  
2 mobile on-demand gasoline providers; and adding a new section to  
3 chapter 19.27 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 19.27  
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) The Washington state building code council shall adopt and  
8 amend rules, as necessary, for the purpose of developing a statewide  
9 process and set of standards for approving mobile on-demand gasoline  
10 providers, as that term is defined in the 2018 international fire  
11 code, for the purpose of allowing mobile on-demand gasoline providers  
12 to provide service in any city or county within Washington. Section  
13 5707.1.1 of the 2018 international fire code shall be amended by the  
14 council to provide for a statewide permit for qualifying mobile on-  
15 demand gasoline providers. All other requirements set forth in  
16 section 5707 of the 2018 international fire code shall remain in  
17 force.

18 (2) The process and set of standards to be developed by the  
19 Washington state building code shall only require mobile on-demand  
20 gasoline providers to obtain a permit for a particular mobile fueling  
21 vehicle in one city or county within Washington, and such vehicle

1 permit shall have reciprocal effect and be recognized in any other  
2 Washington city and county. Local fire marshals shall maintain the  
3 authority to permit mobile fueling vehicles pursuant to section 5707  
4 of the 2018 international fire code. Local fire marshals shall accept  
5 a valid mobile fueling vehicle permit from another Washington city or  
6 county as sufficient to issue a mobile fueling vehicle permit in the  
7 fire marshal's jurisdiction.

8 (3) The Washington state building code council shall develop a  
9 set of criteria creating a category of standard locations that do not  
10 present any atypical safety or environmental concerns wherein  
11 approved mobile on-demand gasoline providers can provide service to  
12 such a location without prior site approval, and a set of criteria  
13 creating a category of nonstandard locations that wherein approved  
14 mobile on-demand gasoline providers can provide service to a  
15 particular location only after local fire marshal approval due to the  
16 presence of an atypical safety or environmental concern, such as an  
17 injection or groundwater well, an above-ground storage tank  
18 containing a class I, II, or III hazardous material, or an electric  
19 vehicle charging station. Nothing in this section prevents a local  
20 fire marshal from having the authority to inspect a standard on-  
21 demand fueling location, to add additional requirements for said  
22 location, or to revoke permission to operate in a particular location  
23 for a specific safety or environmental reason.

24 (4) Except for the creation of a statewide permitting process,  
25 nothing in this section limits the authority of the local fire  
26 marshal to enforce this section or section 5707 of the 2018  
27 international fire code. Any part of the 2018 international fire code  
28 that conflicts with this section is void.

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
