1       AN ACT Relating to creating Seattle Storm special license plates  
2 to fund youth leadership and sports programs; amending RCW 46.18.200,  
3 46.17.220, and 46.68.420; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5       **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2018 c 67 s 5 are each amended to read  
6 as follows:

7       (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the  
8 department:

9       (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized  
10 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license  
11 plates unless otherwise specified;

12       (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the  
13 department;

14       (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter  
15 46.87 RCW; and

16       (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

17       (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special  
18 license plates:

28 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters  
29 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility  
30 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington  
31 state council of firefighters.

32 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license  
33 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten  
34 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)  
35 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate  
36 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting  
37 service before ten years of service have been completed, the  
38 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the

1 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer  
 2 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,  
 3 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter  
 4 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will  
 5 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying  
 6 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates  
 7 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their  
 8 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a  
 9 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be  
 10 surrendered upon conviction.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2018 c 67 s 4 are each amended to read  
 12 as follows:

13 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon  
 14 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the  
 15 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special  
 16 license plate fee as listed in this section.

7       **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2018 c 67 s 2 are each amended to read  
8 as follows:

9       (1) The department shall:

10       (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW  
11 46.17.220;

12       (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial  
13 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and  
14 collection expenses incurred by it; and

15       (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state  
16 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

17       (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor  
18 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has  
19 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license  
20 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been  
21 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special  
22 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the  
23 following appropriate account as created in this section in the  
24 custody of the state treasurer:

Provide funds to Washington state mentors and the association of Washington generals created in RCW 43.15.030 in the following manner: (a) Seventy percent and the remaining proceeds, if any, to Washington state mentors, to increase the number of mentors in the state by offering mentoring grants throughout Washington state that foster positive youth development and academic success, with up to twenty percent of these proceeds authorized for program administration costs; and (b) up to thirty percent, not to exceed forty-thousand dollars annually as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management, to the association of Washington generals, to develop Washington state educational, veterans, international relations, and civics projects and to recognize the outstanding public service of individuals or groups in the state of Washington

7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the  
8 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from  
9 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The  
10 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW,  
11 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

12 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the  
13 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this  
14 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in  
15 subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the  
16 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the  
17 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

18 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to  
19 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the  
20 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the  
21 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety  
22 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

23 (6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners  
24 account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely  
25 for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the  
26 amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least  
27 ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to  
28 youth participants.

29 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit  
30 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in  
31 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status  
32 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization  
33 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act takes effect October 1, 2019.
