1 AN ACT Relating to the renewal of real estate appraiser 2 certificates, licenses, and registrations; and amending RCW 3 18.140.130, 18.140.060, 18.140.160, and 18.140.280.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 18.140.130 and 2005 c 339 s 10 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1)Each original and renewal certificate, license, or 8 registration issued under this chapter shall expire on the 9 applicant's second birthday following issuance of the certificate, 10 license, or registration.

11 (2) To be renewed as a state-certified or state-licensed real 12 estate appraiser or state-registered appraiser trainee, the holder of 13 a valid certificate, license, or registration shall apply and pay the 14 prescribed fee to the director no earlier than one hundred twenty 15 days prior to the expiration date of the certificate, license, or 16 registration and shall demonstrate satisfaction of any continuing 17 education requirements.

18 (3) If a person fails to renew a certificate, license, or 19 registration prior to its expiration and no more than one year has 20 passed since the person last held a valid certificate, license, or 21 registration, the person may obtain a renewal certificate, license,

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1 or registration by satisfying all of the requirements for renewal and 2 paying late renewal fees.

3 ((The director shall cancel the certificate, license, or 4 registration of any person whose renewal fee is not received within 5 one year from the date of expiration. A person may obtain a new 6 certificate, license, or registration by satisfying the procedures 7 and qualifications for initial certification, licensure, or 8 registration, including the successful completion of any applicable 9 examinations.))

10 <u>(4)(a) If a person's certificate, or license is not renewed</u> 11 <u>within one year after the expiration date of the certificate or</u> 12 <u>license, the director must place the certificate or license in</u> 13 <u>inactive status.</u>

14 (b) A state-licensed real estate appraiser, state-certified 15 residential real estate appraiser, or state-certified general real 16 estate appraiser whose certificate or license is placed in inactive 17 status may, within eight years of placement in inactive status, apply 18 for reinstatement of the certificate or license if he or she has:

(i) Maintained continuing education requirements while inactive;
 (ii) Successfully completed the uniform standards of professional
 appraisal practice fifteen-hour class within one hundred eighty days

22 before reinstatement; and

(iii) Paid a fee established by the director.

24 (c) A state-registered trainee real estate appraiser registration 25 that has expired may not be reinstated. The trainee must reapply with 26 the director for a new registration and pay a fee established by the 27 director. Any required class hours, as provided in rule, taken to acquire the registration remains acceptable for a period of five 28 years from the date class hours were taken and will not be required 29 30 to be retaken, except that if the uniform standards class hours are more than two years from the date of the application for 31 32 reinstatement, those class hours must be retaken.

33 (d) The director must cancel a license or certificate that is not 34 renewed or reinstated within eight years of that license or 35 certificate's expiration.

36 Sec. 2. RCW 18.140.060 and 2005 c 339 s 5 are each amended to 37 read as follows:

38 (1) Applications for examinations, original certification,
 39 licensure, or registration, ((and)) renewal certification, licensure,

1 or registration ((shall)), and the reinstatement of a certificate, license, or registration must be made in writing to the department on 2 forms approved by the director. Applications for original and renewal 3 certification, licensure, or registration ((shall)) 4 or the reinstatement of a certificate or license must include a statement 5 6 confirming that the applicant ((shall comply)) is in compliance with applicable rules and regulations and that the applicant understands 7 the penalties for misconduct. 8

9 (2) The appropriate fees ((shall)) <u>must</u> accompany all 10 applications for examination, reexamination, original certification, 11 licensure, or registration, ((and)) renewal certification, licensure, 12 or registration<u>, and the reinstatement of a certificate or license</u>.

13 Sec. 3. RCW 18.140.160 and 2007 c 256 s 1 are each amended to 14 read as follows:

15 In addition to the unprofessional conduct described in RCW 16 18.235.130, the director may take disciplinary action for the 17 following conduct, acts, or conditions:

18 (1) Failing to meet the minimum qualifications for state 19 certification, licensure, or registration established by or pursuant 20 to this chapter;

(2) Paying money other than the fees provided for by this chapter
 to any employee of the director or the commission to procure state
 certification, licensure, or registration under this chapter;

(3) Continuing to act as a state-certified real estate appraiser,
 state-licensed real estate appraiser, or state-registered appraiser
 trainee when his or her certificate, license, or registration is on
 an expired <u>or inactive</u> status;

(4) Violating any provision of this chapter or any lawful rulemade by the director pursuant thereto;

30 (5) Issuing an appraisal report on any real property in which the 31 appraiser has an interest unless his or her interest is clearly 32 stated in the appraisal report;

33 (6) Being affiliated as an employer, independent contractor, or 34 supervisory appraiser of a state-certified real estate appraiser, 35 state-licensed real estate appraiser, or state-registered appraiser 36 trainee whose certification, license, or registration is currently in 37 a suspended or revoked status;

38 (7) Failure or refusal without good cause to exercise reasonable 39 diligence in performing an appraisal practice under this chapter,

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1 including preparing an oral or written report to communicate 2 information concerning an appraisal practice; and

3 (8) Negligence or incompetence in performing an appraisal
4 practice under this chapter, including preparing an oral or written
5 report to communicate information concerning an appraisal practice.

6 Sec. 4. RCW 18.140.280 and 2005 c 339 s 21 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

(1) The director may issue an original registration as a state-8 registered trainee real estate appraiser, to be valid for a term not 9 10 exceeding two years together with a maximum of two renewals, which 11 must be completed within seven years from the original date of registration, unless either period is interrupted by service in the 12 armed forces of the United States of America. Only one of the 13 renewals under this subsection may be issued if the trainee has 14 15 failed to meet qualification standards necessary to take the written 16 examination under RCW 18.140.100.

17 (2) A trainee real estate appraiser may not provide appraisal 18 services other than through and under the direct supervision of a 19 state-certified general real estate appraiser or a state-certified 20 residential real estate appraiser.

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
