- 1 AN ACT Relating to the establishment of a woman's right to be
- 2 fully informed about abortions and the potential risks associated
- 3 with abortions; amending RCW 9.02.100; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** This act may be known and cited as the
- 6 women's right to know act.
- 7 Sec. 2. RCW 9.02.100 and 1992 c 1 s 1 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 The sovereign people hereby declare that every individual 10 possesses a fundamental right of privacy with respect to personal
- 11 reproductive decisions.
- 12 Accordingly, it is the public policy of the state of Washington 13 that:
- 14 (1) Every individual has the fundamental right to choose or 15 refuse birth control;
- 16 (2) Every woman has the fundamental right to choose or refuse to 17 have an abortion, except as specifically limited by RCW 9.02.100
- 18 through 9.02.170 and 9.02.900 through 9.02.902;
- 19 (3) Except as specifically permitted by RCW 9.02.100 through
- 20 9.02.170 and 9.02.900 through 9.02.902, the state shall not deny or

- interfere with a woman's fundamental right to choose or refuse to have an abortion; ((and))
- 3 (4) A woman seeking to have an abortion in the state of
  4 Washington has a right to be fully informed about abortions and the
  5 potential risks associated with abortions. This includes the right to
  6 know about:
  - (a) Abortion methods and associated medical risks;
- 8 (b) Possible adverse psychological effects of abortion;
- 9 <u>(c) Potential harms to the fetus child should the abortion go</u>
  10 wrong;
- 11 (d) Medical benefits and risks of carrying a pregnancy to term;
- 12 <u>(e) Probable gestational age of the fetus at the time the</u>
  13 abortion is to be performed;
- 14 <u>(f) Public and private agencies and services available to assist</u> 15 a woman through pregnancy, childbirth, and raising a child; and
  - (g) Adoption services; and

17 <u>(5)</u> The state shall not discriminate against the exercise of 18 these rights in the regulation or provision of benefits, facilities, 19 services, or information.
