- WHEREAS, National protections were written into law thirty years ago, while the origin of advocacy for persons with disabilities began as early as 1936 when a grass roots organization of parents from all over Washington state formed; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Nearly a quarter of Washingtonians live with some type 6 of disability and rely on such protections every day; and
- WHEREAS, Advocates with disabilities, their families, and allies taught the nation that disability is a part of human existence and developed the rallying cry "nothing about us without us"; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act was the first 11 monumental piece of civil rights legislation for persons with 12 disabilities; and
- 13 WHEREAS, This was the accomplishment of self-advocates, their 14 families, and allies of all races, ethnicities, creeds, genders, 15 abilities, and sexual orientations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The ADA provided an encompassing definition of 17 disability, which contends that disability is not a barrier to an 18 individual's participation in society; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Washington state is still working to ensure that all 20 persons with disabilities have equal opportunities and access to 21 participate fully in our society; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The ADA has been an instrumental tool for advocates with 23 disabilities and families to address such barriers; and

- 1 WHEREAS, We remain committed to working alongside advocates 2 with disabilities and their families to address the barriers to 3 equal opportunity and participation in society;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State Senate commemorate the thirtieth anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which was the result of persistent efforts of self-advocates, their families, and allies from the disability community, but that it is only the beginning of our work.
