33 (1) \$129,050,000 of the state taxable building construction 34 account—state appropriation and ((\$45,950,000)) \$46,950,000 of the 35 state building construction account—state appropriation are provided 36 solely for production and preservation of affordable housing. Of the 37 amounts in this subsection: (a) \$35,000,000 of the appropriation is provided solely for
 housing projects that provide supportive housing and case-management
 services to persons with ((behavioral or)) chronic mental illness.
 When evaluating applications for this population, the department must
 prioritize low-income supportive housing unit proposals that show:

6 (i) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration 7 with one or more health care entities that provide behavioral health 8 care services to individuals eligible for the housing provided under 9 this subsection;

(v) To achieve geographic distribution, the department must prioritize projects in rural areas as defined by the department per RCW 43.185.050 and unserved communities with the goal of maximizing the investment and increasing the number of supportive housing units in rural, unserved communities.

26 (b) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for competitive grant awards for modular housing which 27 includes high quality affordable housing projects that will quickly 28 29 move people from homelessness into secure housing and are significantly less expensive to construct than traditional housing. 30 31 These funds must be awarded to projects with a total project development cost per housing unit of less than \$125,000, excluding 32 the value of land, off-site infrastructure costs, and any capitalized 33 reserves, compliant with the Americans with disabilities act, and 34 with a commitment by the applicant to maintain the housing units for 35 36 at least a fifty year period.

37 (c) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided 38 solely for a state match or state matches on private contributions 39 that fund the production and preservation of affordable housing. 40 Awards must be made using a competitive process. If any funding

remains unallocated after the first fiscal year during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium, the department may allocate the remaining funding through its annual competitive process for affordable housing projects that serve and benefit low-income and special needs populations in need of housing.

6 (d)(i) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is 7 provided solely for housing preservation grants or loans to be 8 awarded competitively.

9 (ii) The funds may be provided for major building improvements, 10 preservation, and system replacements, necessary for the existing 11 housing trust fund portfolio to maintain long-term viability. The 12 department must require a capital needs assessment to be provided 13 prior to contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand 14 the capacity of the property.

15 (iii) To allocate preservation funds, the department must review 16 applications and evaluate projects based on the following criteria:

17 (A) The age of the property, with priority given to buildings18 that are more than fifteen years old;

(B) The population served, with priority given to projects with
at least 50 percent of the housing units being occupied by families
and individuals at or below 50 percent area median income;

(C) The degree to which the applicant demonstrates that the improvements will result in a reduction of operating or utilities costs, or both;

(D) The potential for additional years added to the affordabilityperiod of the property; and

(E) Other criteria that the department considers necessary toachieve the purpose of this program.

(e) (i) \$7,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is
 provided solely for loans or grants to design and construct ultra high energy efficient affordable housing projects.

(ii) To receive funding, a project must provide a life-cycle cost analysis report to the department and must demonstrate energy-saving and renewable energy systems either designed to reach net-zero energy use after housing is fully occupied or designed to achieve the most recent building standard of the passive house institute US as of the effective date of this section.

38 (iii) The department must consider, at a minimum and in any 39 order, the following factors in assigning a numerical ranking to a 40 project:

The state board for 7 community and technical colleges must transfer the two south annex 8 9 properties located at 1534 Broadway and 909 East Pine street in Seattle to Capitol Hill Housing to provide services and housing for 10 homeless youth or young adults for a minimum of fifty years. (h) \$57,050,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for affordable housing projects that serve and benefit lowincome and special needs populations in need of housing. Of the amounts appropriated in this subsection, the department must allocate the funds as follows:

(i) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is providedsolely for housing for veterans;

30 (ii) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided 31 solely for housing that serves people with developmental 32 disabilities;

(iii) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for housing that serves people who are employed as farmworkers; and

36 (iv)(A) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is 37 provided solely for housing projects that benefit homeownership.

(B) During the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium, the department must usea separate application form for applications to provide homeownership

opportunities and evaluate homeownership project applications as
 allowed under chapter 43.185A RCW.

3 (C) In addition to the definition of "first-time home buyer" in 4 RCW 43.185A.010, for the purposes of awarding homeownership projects 5 during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium "first time home buyer" also 6 includes:

7 (I) A single parent who has only owned a home with a former8 spouse while married;

9 (II) An individual who is a displaced homemaker as defined in 24 10 C.F.R. Sec. 93.2 as it existed on the effective date of this section, 11 or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule, 12 consistent with the purposes of this section, and has only owned a 13 home with a spouse;

(III) An individual who has only owned a principal residence not permanently affixed to a permanent foundation in accordance with applicable regulations; or

(IV) An individual who has only owned a property that isdiscerned by a licensed building inspector as being uninhabitable.

19 (2) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must 20 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria 21 in RCW 43.185.070(5).

(3) (a) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts 22 23 appropriated in this section within the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium in the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section. However, if 24 25 upon review of applications the department determines there are not adequate suitable projects in a category, the department may allocate 26 funds to projects serving other low-income and special needs 27 populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an 28 29 identified need for the type of housing proposed.

(b) By June 30, 2021, the department must report on its web site 30 31 the following for every previous funding cycle: The number of 32 homeownership and multifamily rental projects funded by housing trust 33 fund moneys; the percentage of housing trust fund investments made to homeownership and multifamily rental projects; and the total number 34 of households being served at up to eighty percent of the area median 35 income, up to fifty percent of the area median income, and up to 36 thirty percent of the area median income, for both homeownership and 37 38 multifamily rental projects.

(4) (a) The department, in cooperation with the housing financecommission, must develop and implement a process for the collection

of certified final development cost data from each grant or loan recipient under this section. The department must use this data as part of its cost containment policy.

(b) Beginning December 1, 2019, and continuing annually, the 4 department must provide the legislature with a report of its final 5 6 cost data for each project under this section. Such cost data must, 7 at a minimum, include total development cost per unit for each project completed within the past year, descriptive statistics such 8 as average and median per unit costs, regional cost variation, and 9 other costs that the department deems necessary to improve cost 10 11 controls and enhance understanding of development costs. The 12 department must coordinate with the housing finance commission to identify relevant development costs data and ensure that the measures 13 14 are consistent across relevant agencies.

4 Clean Energy Transition 4 (40000042)

5 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following 6 conditions and limitations:

7 (1) The appropriations are provided solely for projects that 8 provide a benefit to the public through development, demonstration, 9 and deployment of clean energy technologies that save energy and 10 reduce energy costs, reduce harmful air emissions, or increase energy 11 independence for the state. Priority must be given to projects that 12 benefit vulnerable populations, including tribes and communities with 13 high environmental or energy burden.

14 (2) In soliciting and evaluating proposals, awarding contracts,15 and monitoring projects under this section, the department must:

16 (a) Ensure that competitive processes, rather than sole source 17 contracting processes, are used to select all projects, except as 18 otherwise noted in this section; and

(b) Conduct due diligence activities associated with the use of public funds including, but not limited to, oversight of the project selection process, project monitoring, and ensuring that all applications and contracts fully comply with all applicable laws including disclosure and conflict of interest statutes.

24 (3) (a) Pursuant to chapter 42.52 RCW, the ethics in public service act, the department must require a project applicant to 25 26 identify in application materials any state of Washington employees or former state employees employed by the firm or on the firm's 27 28 governing board during the past twenty-four months. Application materials must identify the individual by name, the agency previously 29 or currently employing the individual, job title or position held, 30 and separation date. If it is determined by the department that a 31 conflict of interest exists, the applicant may be disqualified from 32 further consideration for award of funding. 33

34 (b) If the department finds, after due notice and examination, 35 that there is a violation of chapter 42.52 RCW, or any similar 36 statute involving a grantee who received funding under this section, 37 either in procuring or performing under the grant, the department in 38 its sole discretion may terminate the funding grant by written 39 notice. If the grant is terminated, the department must reserve its 1 right to pursue all available remedies under law to address the 2 violation.

3 (4) The requirements in subsections (2) and (3) of this section 4 must be specified in funding agreements issued by the department.

(5) \$6,107,000 of the state building construction account—state 5 6 appropriation is provided solely for grid modernization grants for projects that: Advance clean and renewable energy technologies and 7 transmission and distribution control systems; support integration of 8 renewable energy sources, deployment of distributed energy resources, 9 and sustainable microgrids; and increase utility customer options for 10 energy sources, energy efficiency, energy equipment, and utility 11 12 services.

13 (a) Projects must be implemented by public and private electrical utilities that serve retail customers in the state. Priority must be 14 given to: (i) Projects that benefit vulnerable populations, including 15 tribes and communities with high environmental or energy burden; and 16 17 (ii) projects that have a partner that is a tribe or nonprofit organization that serves community eligible entities. Utilities may 18 19 partner with other public and private sector research organizations, businesses, tribes, and nonprofit organizations in applying for 20 21 funding.

(b) The department shall develop a grant application process to competitively select projects for grant awards, to include scoring conducted by a group of qualified experts with application of criteria specified by the department. In development of the application criteria, the department shall, to the extent possible, allow smaller utilities or consortia of small utilities to apply for funding.

(c) Applications for grants must disclose all sources of publicfunds invested in a project.

(d) \$4,400,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely for providing shore power electrification at terminal five for the northwest seaport alliance. In order to receive this grant, the northwest seaport alliance must demonstrate that they applied to the VW settlement for this project and were denied.

37 (6) (a) \$8,100,000 of the state building construction account— 38 state appropriation is provided solely for competitive grants for 39 strategic research and development for new and emerging clean energy 1 technologies. These grants will be used to match federal or other 2 nonstate funds to research, develop, and demonstrate clean energy 3 technologies.

4 (b) The department shall consult and coordinate with the 5 University of Washington, Washington State University, the Pacific 6 Northwest national laboratory and other clean energy organizations to 7 design the grant program. Clean energy organizations who compete for 8 grants from the program may not participate in the design of the 9 grant program. Criteria for the grant program must include life cycle 10 cost analysis for projects that are part of the competitive process.

11 (c) The program may include, but is not limited to: Solar 12 technologies, advanced bioenergy and biofuels, development of new 13 earth abundant materials or lightweight materials, advanced energy 14 storage, battery components recycling, and new renewable energy and 15 energy efficiency technologies.

(d) \$1,000,000 of the state building construction account-state 16 17 appropriation is provided solely for grants that enhance the viability of dairy digester bioenergy projects, energy efficiency, 18 19 and resource recovery to demonstrate advanced nutrient recovery systems that produce value added biofertilizers, reduce trucking of 20 21 lagoon water, and improve soil health and air and water quality. 22 Grants shall include at least one project east of the Cascades and one project west of the Cascades. State agencies must promote and 23 24 demonstrate the use of such recovered biofertilizers through state 25 procurement and contracts.

(7) (a) \$3,000,000 of the state taxable building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely as grants to nonprofit lenders to create a revolving loan fund to support the widespread use of proven energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies by households with high energy burden or environmental health risk now inhibited by lack of access to capital.

32 (b) The department shall provide grant funds to one or more 33 competitively selected nonprofit lenders that will provide matching 34 private capital and will administer the loan fund. The department 35 must select the loan fund administrator or administrators through a 36 competitive process, with scoring conducted by a group of qualified 37 experts, applying criteria specified by the department.

38 (c) The department must establish guidelines that specify 39 applicant eligibility, the screening process, and evaluation and

1 selection criteria. The guidelines must be used by the nonprofit 2 lenders.

(8) \$5,000,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely for the Washington Maritime Innovation Center. The center must be used to support technology acceleration and incubation, and act as a focal point for maritime sustainability, including, but not limited to, supporting technology development for maritime decarbonization and electrification.

9 (9) \$8,300,000 of the state taxable construction account-state appropriation is provided solely for scientific instruments to help 10 accelerate research in grid-scale energy storage at the proposed 11 12 grid-scale energy storage research, development, and testing facility 13 at the Pacific Northwest national laboratory. The state funds are 14 contingent on securing federal funds for the new facility, and are 15 provided as a match to the federal funding. The instruments will support collaborations with the University of Washington and the 16 17 Washington State University.

(10) \$593,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely to the port of Grays Harbor for an offshore ocean wave renewable energy demonstration project.

(11) \$1,500,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely to the ((Port of)) Skagit <u>county</u> <u>public works department</u> for the Guemes ferry dock shore power charging infrastructure.

35 2019-21 Behavioral Health Capacity Grants (40000114)

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

1 (1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the department of commerce to issue grants to community hospitals or 2 other community providers to expand and establish new capacity for 3 behavioral health services in communities. The department of commerce 4 must consult an advisory group consisting of representatives from the 5 department of social and health services, the health care authority, 6 7 representative from managed care organization, one а one representative from an accountable care organization, and one 8 representative from the association of county human services. Amounts 9 provided in this section may be used for construction and equipment 10 11 costs associated with establishment of the facilities. The department of commerce may approve funding for the acquisition of a facility or 12 land if the project results in increased capacity. Amounts provided 13 14 in this section may not be used for operating costs associated with the treatment of patients using these services. 15

16 (2) The department must establish criteria for the issuance of 17 the grants, which must include:

(a) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration
with one or more regional behavioral health entities that administer
the purchasing of services;

(b) Evidence that the applicant has assessed and would meet gaps
 in geographical behavioral health services needs in their region;

(c) Evidence that the applicant is able to meet applicable licensing and certification requirements in the facility that will be used to provide services;

(d) A commitment by applicants to serve persons who are publicly
funded and persons detained under the involuntary treatment act under
chapter 71.05 RCW;

(e) A commitment by the applicant to maintain and operate the
beds or facility for a time period commensurate to the state
investment, but for at least a fifteen-year period;

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) The department shall not expend the appropriation in this section unless and until the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed, or both, in an amount sufficient to complete the project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public for the purpose intended by the legislature. This requirement does not apply to projects where a share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

(2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate that the project site is under control for a minimum of ten years, either through ownership or a long-term lease. This requirement does not apply to appropriations for preconstruction activities or appropriations in which the sole purpose is to purchase real property that does not include a construction or renovation component.

1 (3) Projects funded in this section may be required to comply 2 with Washington's high performance building standards as required by 3 chapter 39.35D RCW.

4 (4) Project funds are available on a reimbursement basis only, 5 and shall not be advanced under any circumstances.

In approving a financing 29 contract not providing for the use of certificates of participation, 30 the state finance committee should be reasonably certain that the 31 contract is excluded from the computation of indebtedness, 32 particularly that the contract is not backed by the full faith and credit of the state and the legislature is expressly not obligated to 33 appropriate funds to make payments. For purposes of this subsection, 34 "financing contract" includes but is not limited to a certificate of 35 36 participation and tax exempt financing similar to that authorized in RCW 47.79.140. 37

38 <u>(7)</u> Department of fish and wildlife: Enter into a financing 39 contract for up to \$3,099,000 plus financing expenses and required 1 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase automated salmon 2 marking trailers.

3 (((7))) <u>(8)</u> Department of natural resources: Enter into a 4 financing contract for up to \$1,800,000 plus financing expenses and 5 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to remodel spaces 6 within agency-owned commercial buildings that will benefit the common 7 school trust.

8 (((8))) <u>(9)</u> Western Washington University: Enter into a financing 9 contract for up to \$9,950,000 plus financing expenses and required 10 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a consolidated 11 academic support services facility. Debt service for this facility 12 may not be paid from additional student fees.

(((9))) <u>(10)</u> Community and technical colleges:

(a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin
 Community College for up to \$27,000,000 plus financing expenses and
 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a
 student recreation center.

(b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Pierce College Puyallup for up to \$2,831,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and construct parking.

(c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla Community College for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student activity center on the Clarkston campus.

(d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla Community College for up to \$6,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student recreation center.

30 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley 31 College for up to \$4,500,000 plus financing expenses and required 32 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Wells Hall replacement 33 project.

34 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Yakima Valley 35 Community College for up to \$22,700,000 plus financing expenses and 36 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build additional 37 instructional and lab classroom space.

(g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Everett
 Community College for up to \$10,000,000 plus financing expenses and

1 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase one or 2 more properties adjacent to the campus.

<u>(11) Eastern Washington University: Enter into a financing</u>
 <u>contract for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses and required</u>
 <u>reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for roof replacement projects.</u>

6 Sec. 7003. RCW 43.19.501 and 2018 c 2 s 7027 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the 9 state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and 10 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account 11 may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed 12 by the department in Thurston county. ((For the 2015-2017 biennium, 13 moneys in the account may be used for studies related to real 14 estate.))

During the ((2017-2019)) 2019-2021 fiscal biennium, the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7004. A new section is added to 2019 c 413 20 (uncodified) to read as follows:

21 The department of social and health services may enter into a 22 long-term, revenue generating lease for up to seven acres of the 23 fircrest residential habilitation center bounded by 15th Ave NE and 24 NE 150th Street and B Street to benefit the charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory trust and support capital investment at the 25 26 residential habilitation center. The department of social and health 27 services and the department of natural resources must amend their lease if necessary to conform with this section. 28

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7005. A new section is added to 2019 c 413 30 (uncodified) to read as follows:

In order to accelerate the reduction of embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for construction projects. 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7006. If any provision of this act or its 2 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 3 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 4 persons or circumstances is not affected.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7007. This act is necessary for the immediate 6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 7 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 8 effect immediately.
