- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 53.08.245 and 2010 c 195 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
 - (1) It shall be in the public purpose for all port districts to engage in economic development programs. In addition, port districts may contract with nonprofit corporations and private and public entities that provide training systems as defined in RCW 28C.18.010 and promote workforce diversity in furtherance of this and other acts relating to economic development.
 - (2) (a) Economic development programs may include ((those programs for)): Occupational job training and placement, job advancement and job retention, preapprenticeship training, or ((educational)) occupational education programs associated with port tenants, customers, and local economic development related to port tenants or port-related economic activities that are sponsored by a port((τ)) and operated by a nonprofit, private, or public entity ((and are in existence on June 10, 2010)).
- 20 (b) <u>Ports seeking to engage in activities or contracts pursuant</u> 21 <u>to this subsection shall, by resolution, declare that port-related</u>
