1       AN ACT Relating to visible clothing requirements for hunting;  
2 adding a new section to chapter 77.15 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 77.15  
5 RCW to read as follows:

6       (1) For the purpose of hunter safety, the commission must adopt  
7 rules determining the times and manner when a person hunting must  
8 wear either fluorescent orange or fluorescent pink clothing or both.  
9 The rules must allow a person hunting to wear either fluorescent  
10 orange or fluorescent pink clothing, or both, in order to meet a  
11 visible clothing requirement when hunting.

12       (2) A violation of this section is an infraction punishable under  
13 RCW 77.15.160.
