1            AN ACT Relating to increasing the maximum tax rate for the voter-  
2 approved local sales and use tax for emergency communication systems  
3 and facilities; and amending RCW 82.14.420.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            **Sec. 1.** RCW 82.14.420 and 2002 c 176 s 1 are each amended to  
6 read as follows:

7            (1) A county legislative authority may submit an authorizing  
8 proposition to the county voters, and if the proposition is approved  
9 by a majority of persons voting, fix and impose a sales and use tax  
10 in accordance with the terms of this chapter for the purposes  
11 designated in subsection (3) of this section.

12            (2) The tax authorized in this section (~~shall be~~) is in  
13 addition to any other taxes authorized by law and (~~shall~~) must be  
14 collected from those persons who are taxable by the state under  
15 chapters 82.08 and 82.12 RCW upon the occurrence of any taxable event  
16 within the county. The rate of tax (~~shall equal one-tenth~~) may not  
17 exceed two-tenths of one percent of the selling price in the case of  
18 sales tax, or value of the article used, in the case of a use tax.

19            (3) Moneys received from any tax imposed under this section  
20 (~~shall~~) must be used solely for the purpose of providing funds for  
21 costs associated with financing, design, acquisition, construction,

1 equipping, operating, maintaining, remodeling, repairing,  
2 reequipping, and improvement of emergency communication systems and  
3 facilities.

4 (4) Counties are authorized to develop joint ventures to  
5 collocate emergency communication systems and facilities.

6 (5) Prior to submitting the tax authorization in subsection (2)  
7 of this section to the voters in a county that provides emergency  
8 communication services to a governmental agency pursuant to a  
9 contract, the parties to the contract (~~shall~~) must review and  
10 negotiate or affirm the terms of the contract.

11 (6) Prior to submitting the tax authorized in subsection (2) of  
12 this section to the voters, a county with a population of more than  
13 one million five hundred thousand in which any city over fifty  
14 thousand operates emergency communication systems and facilities  
15 (~~shall~~) either independently or as a member of a regional emergency  
16 communication agency must enter into an interlocal agreement with the  
17 city to determine distribution of the revenue provided in this  
18 section.

19 (7) Prior to submitting the tax authorized in subsection (2) of  
20 this section to the voters, a county with a population of more than  
21 five hundred thousand but less than one million five hundred thousand  
22 in which any city over fifty thousand operates emergency  
23 communication systems and facilities must enter into an interlocal  
24 agreement with the city to determine distribution of the revenue  
25 provided in this section.

26 (8) A county imposing the tax authorized under this section on  
27 the effective date of this section must submit an authorizing  
28 proposition to the voters as provided under this section to increase  
29 the rate of tax.

30 (9) The Washington state patrol must enter into an  
31 intergovernmental agreement, with a county, city, or regional  
32 communications agency that operates emergency communications systems,  
33 for purposes of interoperable communications, if the following  
34 conditions are met:

35 (a) The intergovernmental agreement is requested by the county,  
36 city, or regional communications agency for this purpose; and

37 (b) The terms and conditions are mutually agreeable.
