- 9 variable renewable generation. Maintaining the adequacy, sufficiency,
- 10 and availability of power supply to the growing populace in the

- 1 investor-owned utilities and consumer-owned utilities, regional planning organizations, transmission operators, and 2 other stakeholders to discuss the current, short-term, and long-term 3 adequacy of energy resources to serve the state's electric needs, and 4 address specific steps the utilities can take to coordinate planning 5 6 in light of the significant changes to the Northwest's power system limited to, technological developments, 7 including, but not retirements of legacy baseload power generation resources, and 8 changes in laws and regulations affecting power supply options. The 9 department and commission shall provide a summary of these meetings, 10 including any specific action items, to the governor and legislature 11 12 within sixty days of the meeting.
- 13 (2) This section expires January 1, 2025.
