1 AN ACT Relating to unlawfully summoning a police officer; and 2 adding a new section to chapter 4.24 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 4.24 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 (1) A person may bring a civil action for damages against any 7 person who knowingly causes a law enforcement officer to arrive at a 8 location to contact another person with the intent to:

9 (a) Infringe on the other person's rights under the Washington 10 state or United States Constitutions;

(b) Unlawfully discriminate against the other person;

12 (c) Cause the other person to feel harassed, humiliated, or 13 embarrassed;

14 (d) Cause the other person to be expelled from a place in which 15 the other person is lawfully located; or

16 (e) Damage the other person's:

17 (i) Reputation or standing in the community; or

18 (ii) Financial, economic, consumer, or business prospects or 19 interests.

20 (2) Upon prevailing in an action under this section, the 21 plaintiff may recover:

- (a) The greater of:
- 2 (i) Economic and noneconomic damages; or

3 (ii) \$250 against each defendant found liable under this section; 4 and

5 (b) Punitive damages.

6 (3) The court may award reasonable attorneys' fees and costs to 7 the prevailing plaintiff in an action under this section.

8

(4) A civil action under this section:

9 (a) May be maintained in a court of limited jurisdiction if the 10 total damages claimed do not exceed the statutory limit for damages 11 that the court of limited jurisdiction may award; and

12 (b) Does not affect a right or remedy available under any other 13 law of this state.
