AN ACT Relating to improving equitable access to postsecondary education by improving data sharing between the office of the superintendent of public instruction, the Washington student achievement council, and institutions of higher education; and amending RCW 28B.10.041 and 28A.150.515.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.10.041 and 2023 c 406 s 1 are each amended to 8 read as follows:

(1) ((Institutions)) The Washington student achievement council 9 10 and institutions of higher education must enter into data-sharing 11 agreements with the office of the superintendent of public instruction to facilitate the transfer of high school 12 student directory information collected under RCW 13 28A.150.515 for the 14 of informing Washington high school students purposes of 15 postsecondary financial aid and educational opportunities available 16 in the state.

17 (2) Data-sharing agreements entered into under this section must 18 provide for the ((sharing of)) education research and data center to 19 share student enrollment and outcome information from institutions of 20 higher education, including federally designated minority serving 21 institutions of higher education that are participating in data-

1 sharing agreements under subsection (4) of this section, to the office of the superintendent of public instruction. 2 Information provided in accordance with this subsection (2) must include the 3 statewide student identifier for each student. To 4 the extent possible, the office of the superintendent of public instruction 5 6 shall transmit student enrollment information to the enrolled students' host districts for the current year. 7

8 (3)(a) Data-sharing agreements entered into by a community 9 college or technical college as defined in RCW 28B.50.030 are limited 10 to informing Washington high school students of postsecondary 11 educational opportunities available within a college's service 12 district as enumerated in RCW 28B.50.040.

13 (b) The state board for community and technical colleges may 14 coordinate with all of the community and technical colleges to 15 develop a single data-sharing agreement between the community and 16 technical colleges and the office of the superintendent of public 17 instruction.

(4) Federally designated minority-serving institutions of higher 18 19 education that are bachelor degree-granting institutions and not subject to subsection (1) of this section may enter into data-sharing 20 21 agreements with the office of the superintendent of public 22 instruction to facilitate the transfer of high school student 23 directory information collected under RCW 28A.150.515 for the purpose informing Washington high 24 of school students of postsecondary 25 educational opportunities available in the state.

(5) Agreements entered into under this section must obligate <u>the</u> <u>Washington student achievement council and</u> institutions that will receive information through an agreement to maintain the statewide student identifier for each student.

30 (6) For the purposes of this section, "statewide student 31 identifier" means the statewide student identifier required by RCW 32 28A.320.175 that is included in the longitudinal student data system 33 established under RCW 28A.300.500.

34 (7) For the purposes of this section, "directory information" has35 the same meaning as in RCW 28A.150.515.

36 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.150.515 and 2023 c 406 s 2 are each amended to 37 read as follows:

38 (1) Beginning in 2024, each school district that operates a high 39 school shall annually transmit directory information for all enrolled

high school students to the office of the superintendent of public
 instruction by November 1st.

3 (2) The office of the superintendent of public instruction must 4 hold the high school student directory information collected under 5 this section and make the information available for <u>the Washington</u> 6 <u>student achievement council and</u> institutions of higher education in 7 accordance with RCW 28B.10.041.

(3) By no later than the beginning of the 2025-26 school year, 8 the office of the superintendent of public instruction shall identify 9 a process for making information provided in accordance with RCW 10 28B.10.041(2) on a student's enrollment in an institution of higher 11 12 education available to the student's school district. The process identified under this subsection (3) must require that information 13 provided to school districts include the statewide student identifier 14 for each student. 15

(4) In transmitting student information under this section,
school districts must comply with the consent procedures under RCW
28A.605.030, the federal family educational and privacy rights act of
1974 (20 U.S.C. Sec. 1232g), and all applicable rules and
regulations.

(5) The student directory information data collected under this section is solely for the following purposes:

(a) Providing information related to college awareness and admissions at institutions of higher education in accordance with RCW 25 28B.10.041; ((and))

(b) <u>Providing information related to postsecondary financial aid</u>
 and educational opportunities in accordance with RCW 28B.10.041; and

28 (c) Providing enrollment and outcome information to the office of 29 the superintendent of public instruction and to school districts 30 related to students from their respective school district under 31 subsection (3) of this section.

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(6) For the purposes of this section:

33 (a) "Directory information" means the names, addresses, email 34 addresses, and telephone numbers of students and their parents or 35 legal guardians; and

36 (b) "Statewide student identifier" has the same meaning as in RCW 37 28B.10.041.
