and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
state council of firefighters.

18 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 19 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least 20 ((ten)) 10 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years 21 and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the 22 appropriate fire If the volunteer firefighter service. leaves firefighting service before ((ten)) 10 years of service have been 23 24 completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the department on the registration renewal date. If the 25 26 volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ((ten)) 10 years 27 and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former 28 volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained 29 for use the person will continue to pay the future registration 30 renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than 31 one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per 32 applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter 33 is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license 34 plates must be surrendered upon conviction.

(5) The department shall not issue the Seattle NHL hockey special license plate until the department receives signature sheets satisfying the requirements identified in RCW 46.18.110(2)(f).

12 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the 13 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from 14 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

(5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board under this subsection, at least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board, at least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

35 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit 36 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 37 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 38 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization 39 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).
