1 AN ACT Relating to helping local governments provide information
2 about the impacts of homelessness; adding a new section to chapter
3 43.110 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that there is a need
6 for housing units, drug addiction interventions, and pathways for
7 people to transition out of homelessness. Billions of dollars are
8 spent annually by the state and local governments for programs to
9 provide housing and services to people in need. This bill intends to
10 help local jurisdictions provide information about their communities
11 in a dashboard format. The legislature recognizes that the department
12 of commerce already collects and posts some information about
13 housing-related expenditures in a dashboard on its website, so this
14 tool is to be created for use on the local government's websites.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.110
16 RCW to read as follows:

17 (1) The department of commerce shall contract for the provision
18 of a computer application that every city and county can use to
19 create a dashboard of information related to the jurisdiction's
20 efforts to address homelessness that can be posted on a website.

1 Contracts for staff support may be made with state agencies or
2 private consulting firms that in the judgment of the department of
3 commerce are qualified to provide such support. The department of
4 commerce must coordinate with the municipal research and services
5 center, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, the
6 association of Washington cities, and the Washington state
7 association of counties in carrying out the activities in this
8 section.

9 (2) The computer application must be able to show the following
10 information on an annual basis:

11 (a) An estimate of the total needed housing units for the
12 jurisdiction, followed by the total new housing units that were
13 permitted to be built by the jurisdiction, and the difference between
14 the total needed housing and the new housing units permitted;

15 (b) The total amount expended by the jurisdiction providing
16 housing assistance and government subsidized housing;

17 (c) Total number of households that received housing assistance
18 or lived in government subsidized housing;

19 (d) The names of the organizations receiving funding for
20 providing services to unsheltered people and the amounts provided;

21 (e) The number of people that are homeless that needed medical
22 treatment for addictions followed by the number that were able to
23 enter an addiction treatment program followed by the number that
24 completed the programs;

25 (f) The number of retail, residential, and car thefts near known
26 locations where people are living in unsheltered communities compared
27 to the jurisdiction's average;

28 (g) The number of emergency calls to the area where people are
29 living in unsheltered communities compared to the jurisdiction's
30 average;

31 (h) The number of arrests, followed by the number of convictions
32 of people for selling illegal narcotics in the jurisdiction;

33 (i) The number of people that are transitioned from homelessness
34 to government subsidized housing or other permanent housing;

35 (j) The total amount expended to clean up or remove garbage from
36 locations where unsheltered people are living within the
37 jurisdiction;

38 (k) The number of homeless encampments near elementary or
39 secondary schools or child day care centers; and

40 (l) The number of homeless encampments known in the jurisdiction.

1 (3) Using appropriations allocated for this purpose, the
2 municipal research and services center must annually assemble the
3 information displayed in the dashboard for all counties and cities
4 and make it available on its website.

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
