EMERGENCY QUARANTINE ORDER NO. 994
PERTAINING TO YELLOW FLOWERING SKELETON WEED

WHEREAS it has been determined that a weed pest known as yellow flowering skeleton weed, Chondrilla juncea L., injurious to the production of grain crops, especially wheat, is known to grow within certain areas of Spokane County in the State of Washington.

WHEREAS it has been established that this weed pest threatens serious injury to the production of all grain crops, especially wheat, within this state.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by the virtue of the authority vested in me by Chapter 17.24 RCW relating to weed pests, insect pests, and plant diseases do hereby proclaim and establish a quarantine to become effective September 30, 1965, setting forth the name of the weed pest for which the quarantine is established, the areas under quarantine, and the methods for eradication and control.

(a) WEED PEST: yellow flowering skeleton weed, Chondrilla juncea L.

(b) AREA UNDER QUARANTINE: all of Spokane County

(c) METHODS OF CONTROL AND ERADICATION:

(1) No person shall knowingly move or cause to be moved, any reproductive part of yellow flowering skeleton weed, Chondrilla juncea L., from the area under quarantine.

(2) Methods of control and eradication shall be only those approved by the Director of Agriculture. Such approval shall be based on recommendations of Washington State University College of Agriculture, or other recognized authority in the field of weed control and eradication.
