WASHINGTON STANDARDS FOR PEACHES  
Effective July 25, 1966

AMENDING ORDER NO. 1014, dated May 31, 1966

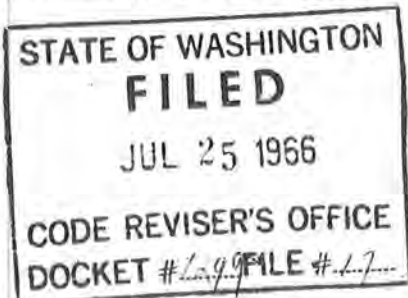
The adoption of this Emergency Amendment to Order No. 1014 establishing standards for peaches grown or marketed within the State of Washington is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare. It is necessary that this Amendment become effective immediately in order that the Department of Agriculture provide proper standards for such peaches.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17 RCW and Chapter 34.04 RCW, establish the following Amendment to Order No. 1014.

Regulation C, Section 3, is hereby amended to read:

"In order to allow for variations incident to proper sizing, not more than ten percent, by count, of the peaches in any lot may be below the specified minimum size and not more than fifteen percent may be above any specified maximum size."
