WASHINGTON STANDARDS FOR BARTLETT AND OTHER SUMMER AND FALL PEARS

Effective August 11, 1966

AMENDING ORDER NO. 930, dated September 5, 1963

The adoption of this Emergency Amendment to Order No. 930 establishing standards for Bartlett and other summer and fall pears grown or marketed within the State of Washington is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare. It is necessary that this Amendment become effective immediately in order that the Department of Agriculture provide proper standards for such pears.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17. RCW and Chapter 34.04 RCW adopt the following Emergency Amendment to Order No. 930:

Regulation 2 (TOLERANCES), under Section 1, a new paragraph shall read as follows:

"In order to allow for variations incident to proper sizing, not more than five percent, by count, of the pears in any lot may be below any specified minimum size and not more than ten percent may be above any specified maximum size."
