WEIGHTS AND MEASURES REGULATION ADOPTING NATIONAL
BUREAU OF STANDARDS HANDBOOK 44, 3rd EDITION

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 19.93 RCW, after due notice as provided under Chapter 34.04 and 42.32 RCW, and public hearing held in Olympia on October 31, 1966 do promulgate the following regulation:

Regulation 1.

The provisions of the National Bureau of Standards Handbook 44, 3rd Edition, as amended in 1966, are hereby adopted in total as provided under RCW 19.93.060 as the specifications, tolerances, and regulations for commercial weighing and/or measuring devices of the state.

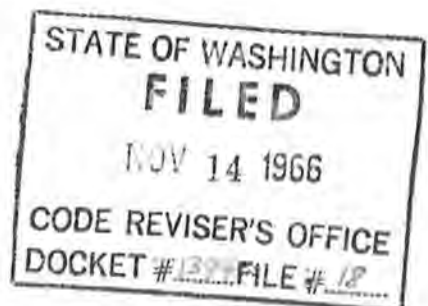

FOREWORD

This Handbook supersedes National Bureau of Standards Handbook 44—Second Edition, published in 1955, and presents a complete revision of technical requirements for commercial weighing and measuring devices. This revision was developed by the Committee on Specifications and Tolerances of the National Conference on Weights and Measures with the assistance of the Office of Weights and Measures of the Bureau, and was adopted by the 56th National Conference in 1965.

Handbook 44 was first issued in 1949, having been preceded by similar Handbooks of various designations and in several forms beginning in 1918. Handbook 44 was revised and reissued as the second edition in 1955. This third edition represents in many respects an entirely new approach to code requirements.

The National Bureau of Standards has a statutory responsibility for "cooperation with the States in securing uniformity of weights and measures laws and methods of inspection." In partial fulfillment of this responsibility, the NBS is pleased to publish these recommendations of the National Conference.

Special mention for the efforts in the development of these Codes of specifications, tolerances, and other technical requirements for commercial weighing and measuring devices, is due the following members of the National Conference on Weights and Measures, who served on the Conference Committee on Specifications and Tolerances during the development of the Code material: R.
