ORDER NO. 1061
(Amending Order No. 893, dated October 1, 1962)

WASHINGTON STANDARDS FOR APPLES, GREEN OR YELLOW VARIETIES
(Effective August 28, 1967)

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17 RCW, after due notice and public hearing held at Quincy, Washington, on July 12, 1967, (Pursuant to RCW 42.32 and 34.04), do hereby amend and establish the following Washington Standards for Apples, Green or Yellow Varieties.

Regulation 2.

GREEN OR YELLOW VARIETIES

Section 2. WASHINGTON FANCY.

- (g) Not over ~~((four))~~ two stings, each having an encircling hard ring, usually green, or a slight depression, provided no individual sting exceeds 1/8 inch in diameter exclusive of any encircling ring.
- (j) 2. Solid russeting, such as is characteristic of frost, sprayburn, hail, and certain insect and disease injury affecting an aggregate area of not to exceed 1/2 inch. This russeting may be continuous from the stem or calyx end.

Section 3. WASHINGTON C GRADE.

- (b) ~~((Limb-rubs-affecting-not-more-than-10-percent-of-the-surface))~~.

Dark limb rubs and bark-like russeting not to exceed an aggregate area of 3/4 inch.

~~((Smooth-solid-russeting-affecting-not-more-than-1/2-of-the-surface-in-the-aggregate,-including-any-russeting-in-the-stem-basin-or-bark-like-russeting-which-does-not-detract-from-the-appearance-of-the-apple-to-a-greater-extent-than-the-smooth-solid-russeting-permitted))~~.

Smooth solid russeting and light limb rubs not affect-

ing more than 10 percent of the surface in the aggregate. Smooth net-like russeting affecting not more than 50 percent of the surface in the aggregate. The light limb rubs, smooth solid and net-like russeting combined shall not exceed 50 percent of the aggregate, exclusive of the stem and calyx bowl.

- (h) Not to exceed ((five)) three stings, each having an encircling hard ring, usually green, or a slight depression, provided no sting exceeds 1/8 inch in diameter exclusive of any encircling ring.

Regulation 7.

MARKING REQUIREMENTS


Section 2. Section 19.93.220 of the Weights and Measures Law (RCW Chapter 19.93).

Consumer packages must be marked with net weight.

Over-wrapped consumer units may be marked with count, if all specimens may be visually counted.

NOTE: Many states require the net weight on all consumer packages
