EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 1063

Effective August 21, 1967

ALASKA APPLE SHIPMENTS


The adoption of this Emergency Order No. 1063 establishing standards for certain apples being shipped for consumption within the area north of the 55th parallel is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare. It is necessary that this Order become effective immediately in order that the Department of Agriculture provide proper standards for such apples.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17 (RCW) and Chapter 34.04 (RCW) establish the following Standards for apples.

Regulation 1. The factor of maturity as set forth in Order No. 893 shall not be controlling on grades for Red Sport varieties of Delicious, Standard Delicious, Golden Delicious, Wine-sap, Jonathan, and Yellow Newtown, when such apples are packed for shipment directly into and for consumption in the area north of the 55th parallel.

Regulation 2. Containers in which such apples are packed shall be stamped in the usual manner and in addition thereto shall be stamped with the word "Alaska" in letters of not less than one-half inch in height.
