Quarantine Order No. [REDACTED]

Pertaining to European Pine Shoot Moth

WHEREAS the fact has been determined that an insect pest known as the European Pine Shoot Moth (*Rhyacionia buoliana schiff*), injurious to all *Pinus* species, is known to occur in certain counties of, or districts of the States of Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin.

WHEREAS it has been established that this insect pest threatens serious injury to all *Pinus* species within the state.

Now, Therefore, I, Joe Dwyer, Director of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me by chapter 17.24 RCW relating to insect pests and plant diseases, pursuant to a public hearing held in Olympia, Washington, on April 4, 1961, do hereby proclaim and establish a quarantine setting forth the name of the pest against which the quarantine is established, the regulated areas, regulated articles, and the conditions governing the issuance of certificates or permits under which regulated articles may be shipped.

PEST: European Pine Shoot Moth (*Rhyacionia buoliana schiff*)

REGULATED AREAS: Connecticut - All counties in the state
Delaware - All counties in the state
Illinois - Counties of Adams, Champaign, Cook, DuPage, Iroquois, Kane, Lake, Logan, McHenry and McLean
Indiana - That part of the state lying north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Wayne, Henry, Hancock, Marion, Hendricks, Putnam, Parke and Vermillion and including the counties of Monroe, Brown and DuBois
Iowa - Counties of Allamakee and Clayton
Maine - Counties of Cumberland, Lincoln and Sagadahoc
Maryland - County of Garrett
Massachusetts - All counties in the state
Michigan - All counties in the state
Missouri - All counties in the state
New Jersey - All counties in the state
New York - All counties in the state
Ohio - That part of the state lying south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Butler, Warren, Clinton, Fayette, Ross,ocking, Athens, Morgan, Noble and Monroe
Pennsylvania - All counties in the state
Rhode Island - All counties in the state
Washington - Counties of King, Mason, Pierce and Spokane
West Virginia - Counties of Berkeley, Brayton, Brooke, Gilmer, Hancock, Jackson, Lewis, Marshall, Mason, Monongalia, Ohio, Pleasants, Preston, Taylor, Tucker and Wetzel
Wisconsin - Counties of Brown, Calumet, Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Door, Fond du Lac, Green, Green Lake, Jefferson, Kenosha, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Milwaukee, Outagamie, Oconto, Ozaukee, Racine, Rock, Sheboygan, Walworth, Washington, Waukesha, Winnebago and Wood

REGULATED ARTICLES: Trees with or without roots, twigs or branches thereof of all *Pinus* species, native or introduced.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING MOVEMENT OF REGULATED ARTICLES: Regulated article shall not be moved from any regulated area into the State of Washington nor out of any regulated area within the State of Washington. Provided however, that cut material which is included in the definition of regulated articles, if not for propagation purposes, may be shipped into within or out of the State of Washington during the period from October 1st to March 1st. Any such shipment must be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorized official of the Department of Agriculture of the state from which the shipment is made, certifying that the material was inspected and found to be free of the European Pine Shoot Moth.

SHIPMENTS FROM NON-REGULATED AREAS: Regulated articles from non-regulated areas will be admitted into the State of Washington provided that each shipment is accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorized official of the Department of Agriculture of the state from which such shipment is made, certifying that the material was inspected and found to be free of the European Pine Shoot Moth and that such material was actually produced in a non-regulated area in which European Pine Shoot Moth is not known to exist.

DISPOSITION OF MATERIAL SHIPPED IN VIOLATION OF THIS QUARANTINE: Regulated materials not meeting the requirements of this quarantine shall be returned to the point of origin, or destroyed at the option and expense of the owner or owners, his or their responsible agent or agents.

VIOLATION AND PENALTY: All violations of this order shall be dealt with according to the provisions of RCW 17.24.100.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This Order shall take effect on and after April 14, 1961

ADDENDUM TO ORDER NO. 841

The adoption of Order No. 841 pertaining to a quarantine of European Pine Shoot Moth is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare; it is necessary that the quarantine go into effect immediately so that the Department may enforce the quarantine as of this date so that persons, having knowledge of the pendency of the quarantine, will not be able to ship infected pine during the thirty day period which ordinarily must elapse before a regulation becomes effective.
