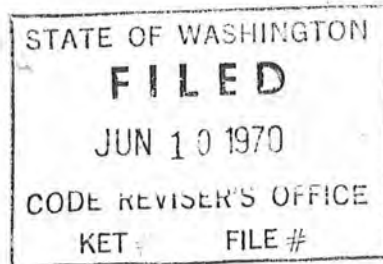

WAC 16-212-001 PROMULGATION. I, Donald W. Moos, director of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under chapter 22.09 RCW, after due notice as provided under chapters 42.32 and 34.04 RCW and a public hearing held in Spokane, Washington on May 19, 1970, do hereby promulgate the following regulation relating to schedule of fees for agriculture commodity inspection and weighing, agricultural commodity grades and standards, and warehouse bonding requirements.

NEW

WAC 16-212-130 WAREHOUSEMAN NET WORTH REQUIREMENTS. Any warehouseman who does not maintain a net worth of five cents per bushel of licensed capacity with a minimum of \$10,000 when that warehouseman is only in the business of storing agricultural commodities, or any warehouseman who does not maintain a net worth of ten cents per bushel of licensed capacity with a minimum of \$10,000 when that warehouseman both stores and warehouses agricultural commodities, shall supply the Department with a bond for deficiencies in net assets above the \$10,000 minimum bond provided in RCW 22.09.090.

WAC 16-224-001 PROMULGATION. I, Donald W. Moos, director of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under chapter 22.09 RCW, after due notice as provided under chapters 34.04 and 42.32 RCW, and a public hearing held in Spokane, Washington, on May 19, 1970, do hereby promulgate the following regulations governing the combining of certain warehouses into stations.

WAC 16-224-010 COMBINING CERTAIN WAREHOUSES INTO STATIONS. The department of agriculture will allow the following warehouses to combine certain warehouses into stations as follows:

- (1) Almira Farmers Warehouse Company is combining North Almira, South Almira, Highland, Govan, Almira, Hanson, and Hartline into one station - Almira 179.
- (2) Almira Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Almira, Hanson, Hartline and Coulee City into one station - Almira 385.
- (3) Boyd Conlee Company is combining Mead, Valleyford, Cashup, and Medical Lake into one station - Mead 18.
- (4) Colfax Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Thornton, Cashup, Steptoe, and Manning into one station - Thornton 75; and Colfax, Glenwood, Mockonema, and Union Center into one station - Colfax 74.
- (5) Columbia Producers, Inc., is combining Warden, Bruce, and Royal City into one station - Warden 19.
- (6) Davenport Union Warehouse Company is combining Davenport, Mondovi, and Omans into one station - Davenport 289.
- (7) Edwall Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Edwall, Canby, Waukon, Sprague, and Edens into one station - Edwall 4.
- (8) Empire Seed Company is combining Othello, Bruce, Royal Camp, and Royal City into one station - Othello 256.
- (9) Fairfield Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Fairfield and Waverly into one station - Fairfield 525.
- (10) Inland Empire Milling Company is combining Ewan, Pine City, and St. John into one station - St. John 706.
- (11) Kettle Falls Elevator, Inc., is combining a new elevator under construction with Kettle Falls into one station - Kettle Falls 46.
- (12) Lacrosse Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Lacrosse, Pampa, Gordon, Hooper, Schreck, and Hay into one station - Lacrosse 131.
- (13) Lamont Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Lamont and Revere into one station - Lamont 476.
- (14) Latah Grain Company, Inc., is combining Latah, Seltice, and Farmington into one station - Latah 687.
- (15) Lawrence Warehouse Company is combining Oakesdale and Belmont into one station - Belmont 140.
- (16) J. H. Llewellyn Warehouse Company is combining Govan and Wilbur into one station - Wilbur 463.
- (17) Odessa Trading Company is combining Batum and Moody into one station - Batum 191; Ruff and Laing into one station - Ruff 69; and Odessa and Nemo into one station - Odessa 342.
- (18) Odessa Union Warehouse Co-op is combining Odessa, Irby, and Lamona into one station - Odessa 305; Lauer, Reiman, Jantz, Schoonover, and Packard into one station - Lauer 420; Harrington, Mohler, and Downs into one station - Harrington 6; and Davenport, Egypt, and Rocklyn into one station - Davenport 872.

- (19) Pendleton Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Whitstran, Kiona, and Prosser into one station - Prosser 648.
- (20) Pullman Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Ewartsville and Pullman into one station - Pullman 95; Albion, Parvin, and Shawnee into one station - Albion 11; and Fallon, Whelan, Busby, and Chambers into one station - Fallon 120.
- (21) Ritzville Warehouse Company is combining Ritzville, Tokio, Ralston, and Marcellus into one station - Ritzville 295.
- (22) Rosalia Producers, Inc., is combining Rosalia, Plaza, Spring Valley, McCoy, Balder, Spangle, Squaw Canyon, and Pine City into one station - Rosalia 415.
- (23) St. John Grain Growers, Inc., is combining St. John, Ewan, Willada, Juno, and Sunset into one station - St. John 534.
- (24) Sun Basin Growers, Inc., is combining Bruce, Royal City, Basin City, Warden, Quincy, and Wheeler into one station - Wheeler 887.
- (25) Tekoa Growers, Inc., is combining Tekoa and Tilma into one station - Tekoa 471.
- (26) Union Elevator & Warehouse Company, Inc., is combining Lind, Pizarro, Schrag, and Paha into one station - Lind 474.
- (27) Uniontown Co-operative Association is combining Uniontown and Leon into one station - Uniontown 430.
- (28) United Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Harrington, Mohler, and Downs into one station - Harrington 807; and Bluestem and Creston into one station - Bluestem 136.
- (29) Walla Walla Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Walla Walla, Port Kelley, Baker-Langdon, Tracy, Sapolil, Dixie, and Valley Grove into one station - Walla Walla 462; Clyde, Sheffler, Eureka, and Pleasant View into one station - Clyde 823; Rulo, Ennis, Paddock, and Dry Creek into one station - Rulo 112.
- (30) Warner Elevator Company is combining Belmont and Warner Siding into one station - Belmont 245.
- (31) Washtucna Grain Growers, Inc., is combining Washtucna and Sperry into one station - Washtucna 653.
- (32) Waterville Union Grain Company is combining Brewster and Mansfield into one station - Mansfield 324; Withrow, Supplee, Douglas, Alstown, and Waterville into one station - Waterville 852.
- (33) Western Farmers Association is combining Quincy, George, and Trinidad into one station - Quincy 212; Sprague, Pifer, and Keystone into one station - Sprague 690; Wallula, Lowden, and Eltopia into one station - Wallula 91; Othello, Royal Camp, Royal City, and Moses Lake into one station - Othello 82; and Granger, Venner, and Sunnyside into one station - Granger 108.
