The adoption of this Emergency Order pertaining to the placing of certain restrictions as to the use of 1-Naphthyl-n-methylcarbamate (commonly known as "Sevin") as an agricultural pesticide is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare. It is necessary that this Order become effective at 1:00 A. M. Pacific Daylight Saving Time, August 27, 1961, in order that the Director may provide means for the protection of bees from the immediate and residual destructive effect of Sevin upon bees and larvae of such bees when Sevin is applied to blossoming agricultural crops including corn.

Now, therefore, I, Joe Dwyer, Director of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by the virtue of the authority vested in me by Chapter 17.21 R.C.W. relating to the application of agricultural pesticides do hereby promulgate the following emergency regulations.

Regulation 1. Pesticide and area under order. The agricultural pesticide 1-Naphthyl-n-methylcarbamate, hereafter referred to in this Order as Sevin, is by this Order declared to be a restricted-use pesticide in all counties east of the Cascade Crest in the State of Washington.


Regulation 2. Limitations on the use of Sevin. The application of Sevin on blossoming crops, including corn, is prohibited.

Regulation 3. Definition of blossoming alfalfa, clover, mint and corn.

- (a) For purposes of this order, alfalfa, clover and mint shall be considered to be in blossom when there are two or more blossoms per square yard on the average in a given field.
- (b) For purposes of this order corn shall be considered to be in blossom when the corn tassels are actively shedding pollen in a given field.

Regulation 4. Effective date. This Order shall be effective after 1:00 A.M. Pacific Daylight Saving Time, August 27, 1961.
