REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF MINK
INTO THE STATE OF WASHINGTON

I, Joe Dwyer, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of authority vested in me under Chapter 16.72, Revised Code of Washington, issue the following rules and regulations governing the importation of mink into the State of Washington:


Regulation 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to import any mink into the State of Washington unless accompanied by an official health certificate showing:

1. Freedom from symptoms of any infectious or contagious disease.
2. Originate from a herd in which there is no evidence of any infectious or contagious disease.
3. Originate from a state or country in which there has been no evidence of virus enteritis, or by special permit from the Department of Agriculture, Olympia, Washington.
4. All shipments to be made in new or cleaned and disinfected shipping containers.

PENALTY: Any person, or firm, or corporation violating any of these regulations shall be guilty of violation of the law and punished by statute provided.
