REGULATIONS RELATING TO REQUIRED TESTS FOR TUBERCULOSIS AND/OR  
BRUCELLOSIS (BANG'S DISEASE) OR ANY INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS  
DISEASE

I, Joe Dwyer, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapters 16.36 and 16.40, Revised Code of Washington, after due notice and hearing, do promulgate the following regulations relating to required tests for tuberculosis and/or brucellosis (Bang's disease) or any infectious or contagious disease.


Regulation 1. Livestock owners shall be required to present and confine their cattle when such cattle are to be tested for tuberculosis and/or brucellosis or any infectious or contagious disease, such confinement and presentment to be in a manner and at such reasonable times as prescribed by the Director of Agriculture.

Regulation 2. Owners must furnish adequate facilities to assure convenient and safe procedures in conducting such tests, which facilities may be required to include corrals, chutes, stanchions and/or squeeze chutes as deemed necessary by the Director or his duly authorized representative or inspector in any given instance.

Regulation 3. All handling of cattle for the purpose of testing or drawing of blood samples shall be the responsibility of the owner.

PENALTY: Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of these regulations shall be guilty of violation of the law and punished as by statute provided.
