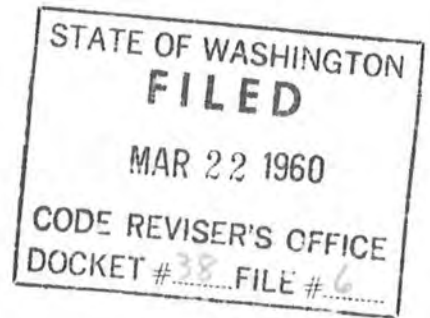

REVISION OF STANDARDS FOR TOMATOES


In accordance with Section 15.16.010, R.C.W., (Section 2855, R.R.S.), an official grade and pack hearing was held in Yakima, Washington, on May 20, 1954, at which time the growers of field grown tomatoes voted to add a Cull Grade to the Standards for Tomatoes, to read as follows:

CULLS shall consist of tomatoes that are immature and which fail to meet the requirements of any of the foregoing grades."

It was also voted to revise the MARKING REQUIREMENTS to read as follows:

"All closed containers shall be legibly marked with the name and address of the grower or packer, the grade and the net weight. If cull tomatoes are packed in closed containers, the word CULLS shall be stenciled on the end of the container in block type letters at least one inch high. (These marking requirements do not apply to tomatoes being sold or shipped to canneries or other processing plants.)"

This order shall take effect on June 15, 1954.
