NEW WAC 16-223-003 PROMULGATION. (This promulgation relates to WAC 16-223-220).

I, Cameron S. Adams, acting director of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under chapters 15.58 and 17.21 RCW, and 34.04 RCW, do hereby promulgate the following emergency regulation relating to essential uses of DDT for 1972.

The adoption of this emergency order establishing the use of DDT on pome fruits, stone fruits, and mint as additional essential uses is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare. It is necessary that this order become effective immediately in order to prevent irreparable injury to pome fruits, stone fruits, and mint.

AMD WAC 16-223-220 ESSENTIAL USES OF DDT FOR 1972. The use and application of DDT shall be limited to those uses which have been declared as "essential uses" for the 1972 year, as provided for in Order No. 1137, WAC 16-223-040(2). The following uses on crops are determined to be essential for commercial plantings only:

Caneberries and Blueberries	Various weevils, especially woods weevil <u>Nenocestes incomptus</u> and obscure weevil, <u>Sciopethes obscurus</u> .
Strawberries	Various weevils, especially woods weevil <u>Nenocestes incomptus</u> and obscure weevil, <u>Sciopethes obscurus</u> .
Ornamentals	Weevils, leaf miners, and European pine shoot moth.
Cranberries	Weevils and cutworms.
Stone Fruits	Shot hole borer, climbing cutworms, army worms, and stink bugs.
Grapes	Cutworms, especially red back cutworm, <u>Euxoa ochrogaster</u> and variegated cutworm, <u>Peridroma saucia</u> .
Hops	Cutworms, loopers.
Potatoes	White grubs. To be used only on new land (not more than two years from virgin soil).
Dry Peas	Pea Weevil.
Aquatic environments & adjacent areas	Permitted when determined by public health officials to be essential for the control of disease vectors, as provided in Order 1137, WAC 16-223-060.
Humans	Pediculoses (louse infestation)- shall be allowed by doctors' prescription only.

Gypsy Moth

Recreational vehicles - shall be allowed when this use is determined to be essential for the USDA to enforce the Federal Domestic Quarantine Order No. 45, which provides for the use of micro-nized DDT - Carbaryl dust to be applied by federal or state inspectors to the undercarriage of the vehicles, using the following precautions:

1. A skirt shall be attached around the base of the vehicle to prevent the DDT dust from entering the atmosphere.
2. A protective tarpaulin shall be placed on the ground under the vehicle to prevent the DDT from contacting the ground during application.

Mint

Cutworms and loopers.

Pome Fruits

Cutworms, Lygus bugs, Stink bugs, and other cat-facing insects PROVIDED, That DDT shall not be sold or made available to any ultimate user for use on pome fruits unless such ultimate user has obtained a user's permit from the department or from an authorized pesticide dealer, and PROVIDED FURTHER, That the department shall not authorize issuance of permits for this use in any area unless the Washington State University Cooperative Extension Service has officially determined that there is an economic infestation of cutworms or one of the cat-facing insects on pome fruit trees in that area, and has so notified the department.
