Dear Mr. White:


RCW 74.16.400 (1977 1st ex.s. C 40) established the Washington Commission for the Blind. The duties of the Office of Services for the Blind of the Department of Social and Health Services as set forth in RCW 74.16.170-300 and RCW 74.17 with rules set forth in WAC 388-72, were transferred to the Commission for the Blind by legislation. Additional duties were added and the legislation was codified in RCW 74.16.400-540.

The Commission for the Blind requests that the Code Reviser in conformity with the Administrative Procedures Act, assign a WAC title to the Commission for the Blind for its rule making use.

The Commission requests a current and complete copy of WAC 388-72 for comparison with our present copy.

The Commission for the Blind would prefer that WAC 388-72 be assigned to the Commission for the Blind, with the concurrence of the Department of Social and Health Services. However, as 388-72 consists of only one chapter, and in view of the new and expanded duties contained in RCW 74.16 it would be difficult to confine all rule making to 388-72. Therefore, could an additional title be assigned to the Commission for the Blind.
