WAC 132S-17-010 CAMPUS CONDUCT. The college believes that it is best to resolve differences that may exist in the campus community in an atmosphere of calm and reasoned dialogue which is consistent with an academic setting. The right of free speech and peaceful assembly is a fundamental tenet of a democratic society and the college subscribes to the viewpoint that the college community shall always be free to express its views and to support causes by orderly means. Further, in order to maintain this right for all faculty and students, it is essential that dissent be conducted in a mature and responsible manner. Infringement upon the rights of others by interfering with the orderly and basic processes of the institution is not consistent with the ideals of academic freedom.

Therefore, campus demonstrations may be conducted only in areas which are generally available to the public, which do not interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic, and do not interfere with classes, scheduled meetings or ceremonies.

Members of the college community found in violation of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action by the college. Non-students violating this policy will be referred to the proper authorities for further disposition.
