C. Purpose:

The primary purpose of the suggested amendments to APR 3 (c) (2) is to reduce barriers to admission to the practice of law for lawyer spouses of active United States military servicemembers. At its July 19, 2024 meeting, the WSBA Board of Governors voted (8 to 1) to recommend these suggested amendments to the Washington Supreme Court.

Lawyers who are spouses of active servicemembers in the United States military often need to relocate because their servicemember spouse is transferred to a new military station. Because of the relocation, the lawyer spouse or "military spouse" often needs to seek admission to practice law in multiple jurisdictions. Applying for admission to practice law is expensive both in terms of direct costs and in terms of lost income while awaiting admission. In 2019, to reduce the time and expense associated with applying for admission, the Washington Supreme Court adopted the "Military Spouse Admission by Motion" pathway for admission as a lawyer under APR 3 (c) (2).

The military spouse admission by motion is similar to general admission by motion. However, unlike admission by motion, the WSBA Admissions Policies do not require the investigation and verification of the information to be done by the National Conference of Bar Examiners (NCBE); instead, it is done in-house by WSBA staff resulting in a faster and less expensive process for military spouse applicants. The NCBE investigation takes approximately four to six months to complete and the NCBE collects an additional fee from the applicant which is currently \$550. Therefore, military spouse applicants become licensed relatively quickly while at the same time saving the cost of the NCBE investigation fee.

In addition, to qualify for military spouse admission by motion, the applicant cannot qualify for general admission by motion nor admission by UBE score transfer. Essentially, that means the only people who can qualify for military spouse admission by motion are people who do not have a transferrable UBE score and who have less than three years of practice experience. With 41 jurisdictions administering the UBE, this significantly reduces the population who could qualify for military spouse admission. It could also apply to a small pool of people who have an old UBE score and have not been practicing recently.

Finally, the Washington Supreme Court is considering suggested amendments to APR 3 (c) (1) that would reduce the active legal experience for general admission by motion to one year. That will further reduce the pool of applicants who could qualify for military spouse admission by motion because that will eliminate the military spouse option for anyone with more than one year of practice in the preceding three years.

The suggested amendments would remove the criteria that the military spouse applicant not qualify for admission by motion and not qualify for admission by UBE score transfer (APR 3 (c) (2) (B) & (C)). Removal of these barriers will result in more equitable access for military spouses to the practice of law by allowing all military spouses who would otherwise qualify under the rule to take advantage of this more affordable and faster pathway to admission.

3. Purpose: I am suggesting a modification of RAP 9.2(b) that removes the second sentence, which currently reads, "A verbatim report of proceedings provided at public expense should not include the voir dire examination or opening statements unless appellate counsel has reason to believe those sections are relevant to the appeal or they are requested by the client for preparing a statement of additional grounds."

I am making this suggested change for three reasons.

First, I am concerned that because the way the rule is currently structured, some appellate counsel treat this as discouraging the preparation of a VRP containing voir dire examination or opening statements at the outset of the representation as a default position.

Basically, the rule suggests opening statements and voir dire examination are presumed to be irrelevant on appeal. This presumption can only be overcome if appellate counsel is informed independently (e.g. by trial counsel) that something of import occurred during those

phases of the trial. If that independent source doesn't tip appellate counsel off (e.g. if trial counsel and appellate counsel don't communicate fully, or if trial counsel doesn't realize that something of note occurred during voir dire examination or opening statement and therefore neglects to mention it), some otherwise meritorious issues may be inadvertently waived.

Second, after hearing Chief Justice González speak at a CLE in March of 2024, I was struck by his poor opinion of how trial counsel are conducting voir dire examination. I believe that belief may be widespread amongst appellate courts. I also believe that belief may be exacerbated by the narrow opportunities appellate courts have to review how voir dire examination is actually conducted in ordinary cases. If the only jury selection proceedings to which appellate courts are routinely exposed are those in which appellate counsel has determined a problem occurred, that would tend to make it appear that the quality of voir dire examination in general is problematic.

Third, GR 37 (g) (v) identifies, as a circumstance the court should consider in ruling on an objection to the exercise of a peremptory challenge, "whether the party has used peremptory challenges disproportionately against a given race or ethnicity, in the present case or in past cases." Without voir dire examination being routinely transcribed, it is more difficult to make a record about disproportionate use of peremptory challenges in past cases.

The only purpose in favor of the current inclusion of the second sentence of RAP 9.2(b) appears to be avoiding unnecessarily expending public resources. However, RAP 9.2 elsewhere already instructs the parties to "arrange for transcription of all those portions of the verbatim report of proceedings necessary to present the issues raised on review," and permits a party to "arrange[] for less than all of the verbatim report of proceedings." The idea of having only part of a trial transcribed, and therefore avoiding unnecessary costs, is already baked in to the rule, even without the sentence I am suggesting be removed.

The second sentence of RAP 9.2(b) is, essentially, redundant and unnecessary to further the goal of reducing costs. But by signaling two parts of the trial—voir dire examination and opening statements—are presumed irrelevant, with all other parts of the trial as having no presumption whatsoever—leaving the decision of whether to designate certain parts of the record to appellate counsel's discretion, as determined by whether appellate counsel believes them necessary to present the issues raised on review—serves no legitimate purpose.

4. Is a Public Hearing Recommended? I am not taking any position on whether a public hearing is needed.

5. Is Expedited Consideration Requested? I don't believe exceptional circumstances justifying expedited consideration of the suggested rule exist.

C. Purpose:

The purpose of the suggested amendments to APR 4(d) is to implement the Washington Supreme Court's adoption of the Washington Bar Licensure Task Force recommendation regarding the NextGen Bar Exam. On March 15, 2024, the Washington Supreme Court entered order number 27500-B-710 adopting the WBLTF's recommendation to adopt the NextGen Bar Exam beginning with the July 2026 bar exam. The NextGen Bar Exam is owned by the National Conference of Bar Examiners (NCBE). The NCBE intends for the NextGen Bar Exam to be a new version of the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE), maintaining the ability for applicants to transfer scores between UBE jurisdictions. Although the exam is referred to as the NextGen Bar Exam, it will still be the UBE, but with updated content and formats. In addition, because the NextGen version of the UBE will have a different scoring scale, a new minimum passing score will need to be determined. Accordingly, the amendments needed to the APR to implement adoption of the NextGen exam are simply to distinguish between the two versions of the UBE and identify the minimum passing score for each version.

The NCBE's work to determine minimum passing scores for the NextGen exam relative to the passing scores for the original version of the UBE will take place next year. We expect to have a NextGen passing score by August or September 2025. Given the time involved for rule amendments through the GR 9 process, we are submitting these suggested amendments now and will ask the Court to enter an order setting the passing score for the NextGen exam when it is finally determined. A technical amendment can then be requested at that time to amend APR 4(d) to include the score in the APR.

RULE 11.2 QUALIFICATIONS AND CORE SERVICES OF PROBATION DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL

Deliver effective and technical presentations. ~~to interview and counsel offenders with a wide variety of offender problems, including, but not limited to, alcoholism, domestic violence, mental illness, sexual deviancy; to testify; to communicate with referral resources; and to prepare legal documents and reports.~~

(3) Complete the Misdemeanant Probation Counselors Academy per WAC 139-10-235 within one year of hire.

(4) ~~Anyone not meeting the above qualifications and having competently held the position of probation officer for the past two years~~ A probation officer hired prior to the adoption of the 2025 amendments to ARLJ 11 shall be deemed to have met the qualifications.

(b) Probation Officer--Core Services.

(1) Conduct ~~pre- and postsentence~~ investigations with through interviews and extensive research that may include, but is not limited to, criminal history, contact with victims, personal history, social and economic needs, community resource needs, counseling/treatment needs, work history, and family, and employer, and community support. complete written pre- and postsentence reports, which includes sentencing recommendations to the court.

(2) For offenders referred to the misdemeanor probation department, determine their risk to the community using a standardized classification system with a minimum of monthly interviews for offenders classified at the highest level. Monitor and/or supervise defendants according to the risk, needs, and classification systems used by the court.

(3) Evaluate offenders' social problems, defendants through interview and/or assessments to determine appropriate service referrals. Identify potential barriers and defendant amenability to different types of treatment programs and treatment services., and determine appropriate referral. Conduct case management planning with defendants and assess compliance with court ordered probation conditions.

(4) Supervise offenders with interviews depending on risk classification system. Complete written reports, which may include sentencing and/or sanctioning recommendations to the court. Communicate with judicial officers regarding probation matters. Testify in court as required.

(5) Oversee community Review reports from agencies providing court ordered services required of offenders with input to defendants. the judicial officer (e.g., alcohol/drug, domestic violence, sexual deviancy, and mental illness).

(6) Other Duties. The core services listed under both probation officer and probation clerk are not meant to exclude other duties that may be performed by either classification of employee or other court clerical staff, such as record checks, calendaring court proceedings, and accounting of fees.

(c) Probation Clerk Qualifications.

(1) High school or equivalent diploma and two years practical experience in social services, criminal justice, or a related field.

(2) Efficient in all facets of basic ~~e~~Clerical skills including but not limited to keyboarding, computer familiarity and competence, data entry, filing, document review, multi-tasking, prioritization, and customer service positive public interaction.

(3) Above-average ~~a~~Ability to work with individuals experiencing mental health issues, substance use disorders, and homelessness. in dealing with stress and difficult clients.

(4) Ability to complete and perform multi-task assignments. A probation clerk hired prior to the adoption of the 2025 amendments to ARLJ 11 shall be deemed to have met the qualifications.

(d) Probation Clerk--Core Services.

(1) Monitor compliance of treatment obligations with professional treatment providers. receipt of progress reports and documents regarding compliance with court-ordered probation conditions.

(2) Report offender Monitor defendant non-compliance with conditions of sentence to the court. per court practice.

(3) Coordinate treatment referral information, and monitor community agencies for statutory reporting compliance. Communicate with defendants to collect and verify personal contact information. Provide resource information for court-ordered probation conditions and defendant needs.

~~(4) Anyone not meeting the above qualifications and having held the position of probation clerk for the past two years shall be deemed to have met the qualifications.~~

~~(5) Other Duties. The core services listed under both probation officer and probation clerk are not meant to exclude other duties that may be performed by either classification of employee, or other court clerical staff, such as record checks, calendaring court proceedings, and accounting of fees.~~

RULE 11.3 STATUTORY PROBATION SERVICE FEES TO BE USED FOR PROBATION SERVICES

All positions, which are funded by statutory probation service fees, shall be limited to working with individuals or cases ~~who are on~~ receiving probation services. Any additional funds raised from statutory probation services fees beyond what is necessary to fund the positions in the probation department shall be used to provide additional levels of probation services.

C. Purpose:

These suggested amendments to the Standards for Indigent Defense implement an interim caseload standard for public defense appeals pending the outcome of a workload study that will result in a final appellate caseload standard.

In October 2023, the Washington Supreme Court requested that the Washington State Bar Association's Council on Public Defense review and update caseload standards in the Court's Standards for Indigent Defense. In March 2024, the CPD recommended, and the WSBA Board of Governors approved, comprehensive amendments to the Standards for Indigent Defense, including revised caseload standards. At that time, CPD and the WSBA Board reserved the matter of standards pertaining to caseloads for appeals in public defense cases due to the differences in trial and appellate public defense practice and because the resources available to develop trial-level standards did not address appeals. The WSBA Board and CPD concluded the appellate standards should be reviewed by individuals with expertise in that practice area.

The CPD convened a committee of judges, law professors, private attorneys, and appellate public defense practitioners to update caseload standards for attorneys handling appeals in public defense cases. This committee determined that additional research is necessary before a final caseload standard could be recommended. The committee has begun the process of soliciting proposals from outside researchers for an appellate workload study.

It is likely the workload study will take one year or more to complete. Concerningly, however, a survey of Washington appellate public defense practitioners conducted by the CPD appellate committee indicates the current caseload standard does not permit attorneys to devote the necessary time to their cases. For example, 94% of survey respondents stated they needed to triage or limit case activities because of insufficient time, and 87% stated they needed to request filing extensions for opening briefs in three-quarters or more of their cases. In addition, the survey responses indicated appellate public defense attorneys are overwhelmingly overworked - 72% stated they frequently work on the weekends and 82% stated they feel exhausted and drained at the end of the workday.

These survey responses and committee members' experience indicate an immediate need for caseload updates to ensure appellate public defenders can provide adequate representation to their clients. A workload study resulting in a final appellate caseload standard, however, will take time. WSBA, therefore, proposes an interim standard modifying the appellate caseload standard from a maximum of 36 appeals per attorney per year to 25 appeals per attorney per year while the workload study is underway. This caseload is based on the standard in place prior to 2007. In 2007, the caseload maximum was increased from 25 appeals to 36 appeals, assuming an average transcript length of 350 pages. The increase was based on predictions that improvements in technology would make appellate work faster. Responses to the survey of appellate practitioners suggest increased use of technology in public defense cases has likely had the opposite effect, increasing the

time necessary to provide adequate appellate defense. For that reason, the committee proposes a return to the 25-appeal standard until a final standard can be developed based on the results of the workload study. The WSBA Board of Governors adopted this recommended interim caseload standard as part of the WSBA Standards for Indigent Defense Services and approved the suggested amendments to the Court standards on September 7, 2024.

D. Hearing: A hearing is not requested. The Court, however, has scheduled a public hearing for September 25, 2024, to consider the previously proposed amendments to the Standards for Indigent Defense. Proponents do not oppose consolidating the suggested amendments relating to appellate caseloads with the hearing on the comprehensive amendments to the Standards.

E. Expedited Consideration: Expedited consideration is requested due to the interim nature of the suggested amendments.

C. Purpose:

This request is based upon recommendations from the chapter authors of the 2021: How Gender and Race Affect Justice Now report.

Incarceration can have lifelong adverse consequences for incarcerated parents, their children, their loved ones, and their children's caregivers. Strict timelines, along with barriers to obtaining court documents, mandatory court forms, and access to legal advice and information, can lead to an inability to participate in court processes which results in negative consequences for incarcerated parents in family law cases, especially for mothers. Incarcerated mothers are significantly more likely than incarcerated fathers to be primary caregivers prior to their incarceration. When incarcerated parent litigants are unable to respond and participate in court proceedings due

to procedural barriers imposed by their incarceration, courts lack complete information. In fact, they are often forced to enter default orders. We can do better.

Civil Rule 12 governs response deadlines in family law cases as well as other civil cases. It provides generally 20 days for respondents who are personally served within the state of Washington to file a response. Incarcerated litigants often find it impossible to meet this deadline because they cannot access forms and legal information while incarcerated.

Federal funding restrictions on legal aid prohibit organizations that receive federal Legal Services Corporation funding from representing incarcerated litigants in court proceedings. In Washington, Northwest Justice Project, the largest statewide legal aid provider in Washington, receives federal Legal Services Corporation funding and is therefore prohibited from providing court representation to incarcerated litigants. Other statewide legal aid providers rely on other sources of funding to serve incarcerated individuals, but those providers do not represent parents in family law matters. As a result, incarcerated indigent parents in Washington usually must represent themselves.

But pro se litigants in jail, detention facilities, and prisons are unable to access mandatory court forms, legal information, and legal assistance in the same timely manner as other pro se litigants.

The Washington State Department of Corrections does not permit incarcerated litigants to access the internet due to safety concerns. This severely hampers the ability of pro se litigants to access the mandatory family law forms located on the courts' website or free pro se assistance resources like WashingtonLawHelp. As a result, incarcerated litigants often must send written requests via regular mail to courts, legal services providers and other resources to obtain the forms and information necessary to respond to their legal actions.

While some state prisons have law libraries, the needed legal information within them is inaccessible in a timely manner to many litigants. Department of Corrections policy 590.500 prioritizes use of the law library for incarcerated individuals challenging their criminal sentence and/or confinement, civil rights, or dependency matters. Family law and other civil issues are not priority matters under the policy. Individuals wishing to use the law library for family law and other civil matters must wait behind individuals with what the Department of Corrections has deemed more urgent matters, a process that in some circumstances can take weeks. Four prisons in Washington do not have law libraries at all, so individuals in those facilities must request a transfer to use the law library at a facility that has one. Many jails and detention facilities similarly do not have law libraries or legal access at all.

Within this context, many incarcerated parent litigants are unable to respond to their family law matters within the 20 days dictated by Civil Rule 12. As a result, stakeholders and incarcerated parents report that many final orders are entered by default. Without the incarcerated parent's response, the court lacks information about the facts surrounding a parent's incarceration, their role prior to incarceration in their child's life, and the options to remain engaged in their child's life while incarcerated. This can result in dramatically less contact between a child and incarcerated parent than the full facts of the situation and best interests of the child require, not only for the period in which they are incarcerated but long after

their release as well. Courts should have access to the full set of facts so that decisions can be based on the merits of each case.

The proposed change would allow incarcerated litigants more time to access law libraries, courts, legal services providers and other resources to obtain the mandatory forms and legal information necessary to respond to their legal actions while incarcerated. The proposed change would afford incarcerated litigants the same extended time period of 60 days that is afforded to respondents served out of state and by publication.

(4) Within 60 days after the service of the summons upon the defendant if the summons is served in a jail, detention facility, or prison facility pursuant to rule 4.

(5) ~~(4)~~ Within the period fixed by any other applicable statutes or rules.

A party served with a pleading stating a cross claim against another party shall serve an answer thereto within 20 days after the service upon that other party. The plaintiff shall serve a reply to a counterclaim in the answer within 20 days after service of the answer or, if a reply is ordered by the court, within 20 days after service of the order, unless the order otherwise directs. The service of a motion permitted under this rule alters these periods of time as follows, unless a different time is fixed by order of the court.

(A) If the court denies the motion or postpones its disposition until the trial on the merits, the responsive pleading shall be served within 10 days after notice of the court's action.

(B) If the court grants a motion for a more definite statement, the responsive pleading shall be served within 10 days after the service of the more definite statement.

(b) How Presented. Every defense, in law or fact, to a claim for relief in any pleading, whether a claim, counterclaim, cross claim, or third party claim, shall be asserted in the responsive pleading there-to if one is required, except that the following defenses may at the option of the pleader be made by motion:

(1) lack of jurisdiction over the subject matter,

(2) lack of jurisdiction over the person,

(3) improper venue,

(4) insufficiency of process,

(5) insufficiency of service of process,

(6) failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted,

(7) failure to join a party under rule 19. A motion making any of these defenses shall be made before pleading if a further pleading is permitted. No defense or objection is waived by being joined with one or more other defenses or objections in a responsive pleading or motion. If a pleading sets forth a claim for relief to which the adverse party is not required to serve a responsive pleading, the pleader may assert at the trial any defense in law or fact to that claim for relief. If, on a motion asserting the defense numbered (6) to dismiss for failure of the pleading to state a claim upon which relief can be granted, matters outside the pleading are presented to and not excluded by the court, the motion shall be treated as one for summary judgment and disposed of as provided in rule 56, and all parties shall be given reasonable opportunity to present all material made pertinent to such a motion by rule 56.

(c) Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings. After the pleadings are closed but within such time as not to delay the trial, any party may move for judgment on the pleadings. If, on a motion for judgment on the pleadings, matters outside the pleadings are presented to and not excluded by the court, the motion shall be treated as one for summary judgment and disposed of as provided in rule 56, and all parties shall be given reasonable opportunity to present all material made pertinent to such a motion by rule 56.

(d) Preliminary Hearings. The defenses specifically enumerated (1)-(7) in section (b) of this rule, whether made in a pleading or by motion, and the motion for judgment mentioned in section (c) of this rule shall be heard and determined before trial on application of any party, unless the court orders that the hearing and determination thereof be deferred until the trial.

(e) Motion for More Definite Statement. If a pleading to which a responsive pleading is permitted is so vague or ambiguous that a party cannot reasonably be required to frame a responsive pleading, or if more particularity in that pleading will further the efficient economical disposition of the action, the party may move for a more definite statement before interposing a responsive pleading. The motion shall point out the defects complained of and the details desired. If the motion is granted and the order of the court is not obeyed within 10 days after the notice of the order or within such other time as the court may fix, the court may strike the pleading to which the motion was directed or make such order as it deems just.

(f) Motion To Strike. Upon motion made by a party before responding to a pleading or, if no responsive pleading is permitted by these rules, upon motion made by a party within 20 days after the service of the pleading upon the party or upon the courts own initiative at any time, the court may order stricken from any pleading any insufficient defense or any redundant, immaterial, impertinent, or scandalous matter.

(g) Consolidation of Defenses in Motion. A party who makes a motion under this rule may join with it any other motions herein provided for and then available to the party. If a party makes a motion under this rule but omits therefrom any defense or objection then available to the party which this rule permits to be raised by motion, the party shall not thereafter make a motion based on the defense or objection so omitted, except a motion as provided in subsection (h) (2) hereof on any of the grounds there stated.

(h) Waiver or Preservation of Certain Defenses.

(1) A defense of lack of jurisdiction over the person, improper venue, insufficiency of process, or insufficiency of service of process is waived,

(A) if omitted from a motion in the circumstances described in section (g), or

(B) if it is neither made by motion under this rule nor included in a responsive pleading or an amendment thereof permitted by rule 15(a) to be made as a matter of course.

(2) A defense of failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted, a defense of failure to join a party indispensable under rule 19, and an objection of failure to state a legal defense to a claim may be made in any pleading permitted or ordered under rule 7(a), or by motion for judgment on the pleadings, or at the trial on the merits.

(3) Whenever it appears by suggestion of the parties or otherwise that the court lacks jurisdiction of the subject matter, the court shall dismiss the action.

(i) Nonparty at Fault. Whenever a defendant or a third party defendant intends to claim for purposes of RCW 4.22.070(1) that a nonparty is at fault, such claim is an affirmative defense which shall be affirmatively pleaded by the party making the claim. The identity of any nonparty claimed to be at fault, if known to the party making the claim, shall also be affirmatively pleaded.

Introduction

The King County Department of Public Defense, the Washington State Office of Public Defense, the Washington Defender Association, and the Snohomish County Office of Public Defense propose changes to

CrR/CrRLJ 3.2 to bring greater clarity to the factors that the trial court may consider when imposing pretrial conditions of release. Instead of an unduly broad criterion of "interference with the administration of justice", the proposed amendment will ensure the trial court properly considers whether a person will seek to intimidate or threaten witnesses, victims, and court employees or seek to tamper with evidence.

Background

Under CrR/CrRLJ 3.2, a court may impose conditions of release when the court finds there is a likely danger that the accused... will seek to intimidate witnesses, or otherwise unlawfully interfere with the administration of justice," but the rule does not define "administration of justice." This lack of clarity undermines the presumption of release, as the State has successfully argued that factors as commonplace as past failures to appear constitute likely interference with the administration of justice.

We have seen the state argue and the court impose bail after finding that a person is likely to commit a *nonviolent offense* and thus violate release conditions, which would undermine the "administration of justice." In addition, increasingly often, when examining the interference with the "administration of justice" prong, courts consider whether a person has previously violated conditions of release, even if the violations were unrelated to any behavior towards witnesses, court employees, victims or evidence.

While there is little appellate caselaw interpreting the "administration of justice" prong of CrR/CrRLJ 3.2, in *State v. Rose*, the Court of Appeals applied a broad interpretation, writing that "no evidence in Wentz's case supported that he would be likely to commit a violent crime or intimidate a witness... Accordingly, the only remaining possibility is that the trial court found there was a likely danger that Wentz would 'otherwise unlawfully interfere with the administration of justice'... we presume that failing to attend a hearing is an unlawful interference with the administration of justice." 146 Wn. App. 439, 454, 191 P.3d 83, 91 (2008).

By clarifying the "administration of justice" prong to focus on whether a person will seek to intimidate or threaten witnesses, victims or court employees, or tamper with evidence, the Court can focus the inquiry and mitigate the risk that conditions of release like unaffordable bail are unnecessarily imposed. This is critical because the harms of unaffordable bail and pretrial incarceration are well known, with research demonstrating that that short periods of incarceration frequently upend a person's employment, housing, child custody, and access to health care.¹

In addition, greater clarity regarding the "administration of justice" prong is also important because studies demonstrate that both the imposition and effect of bail are racially disproportionate.² The racial disproportionality of the bail system has additional, far-reaching impacts due to the deleterious impact that pretrial incarceration has on case outcomes.³

Conclusion

The "administration of justice" prong must be clarified given the known harms of pretrial incarceration that result when unaffordable bail is imposed. Through this proposed amendment, the trial court will still be able to consider whether a person is likely to tamper with evidence or intimidate or threaten witnesses, victims, or court employees.

(6) Require the accused to post a secured or unsecured bond or deposit cash in lieu thereof, conditioned on compliance with all conditions of release. This condition may be imposed only if no less restrictive condition or combination of conditions would reasonably assure the safety of the community. If the court determines under this section that the accused must post a secured or unsecured bond, the court shall consider, on the available information, the accused's financial resources for the purposes of setting a bond that will reasonably assure the safety of the community and prevent the defendant from ~~intimidating witnesses or otherwise unlawfully interfering with the administration of justice~~ or threatening a witness, victim or court participant, or tampering with evidence;

A. Name of Proponent: Judicial Information Systems Committee
(JISC)

B. Spokespersons: Justice Barbara A. Madsen, Chair
Judge John Hart, Vice-Chair

C. Purpose:

These revisions to the language of the Judicial Information Sys-
tems Committee (JISC) Rules (JISCRs) are being proposed to reconcile
various sections to developments in organizational changes, policies,
and current technology, which have occurred since the inception of the
JISC in 1976 or the most recent update to the JISCRs.

The JISC considered the revisions proposed to these rules at its
regular meetings throughout 2024. Each of these changes were consid-
ered by the committee and unanimously approved. The changes proposed
represent the consensus of the committee on changes needed to bring
these rules into line with changes that have occurred since they were
last updated.

We seek to amend, delete, and add language to JISCR 1 to clarify the responsibility over the Judicial Information System and more accurately define which system is administered.

We seek to amend language to JISCR 2 to update the name of an association and to correct grammar.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 3 to update terminology and to correct grammar.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 4 to reflect the current stage of the Judicial Information System (JIS).

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 5 to update terminology and to include the statewide data standard, and the process and responsibilities surrounding this standard.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 6 to update terminology and to revise the entity responsible for reporting.

We seek to amend language to JISCR 7 to revise the entity responsible for creating a set of codes for criminal charges, civil actions, juvenile referrals, attorney identification, and standard disposition identification codes. We also seek to eliminate the responsibility for creating case numbering systems as this function is obsolete in modern case management systems. We seek to amend JISCR 8 to update terminology and to revise the entity responsible for records retention.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 9 to update terminology.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 10 to update terminology and to revise the entity responsible for assigning and maintaining a uniform attorney identification number for use in JIS.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 11 to update terminology and to revise the entity responsible for maintaining on file a copy of all system documentation related to the collection, storage, and dissemination of such information.

We seek to amend and add language to JISCR 14 to update terminology and to correct grammar. The revisions also clarify that the activity governed by this rule is the entry of court data, rather than the broader term data processing.

We seek to amend, delete, and add language to JISCR 15 to update terminology, delete a section that has been marked rescinded, update the sequential order of sections to account for the deletion, include references to GR31 and GR 31.1 to further substantiate JISCR 15, and to revise the entity responsible for promulgating policies and procedures for handling applications for electronic information. Also, we propose the removal of a policy statement at the beginning of this rule.

We seek to amend, delete, and add language to JISCR 16 to update terminology, specify jurisdiction over the policies and guidance of the Supreme Court and the Judicial Information System Committee as it relates to the development, management, operation, and use of the Judicial Information System.

We seek to add language to JISCR 17 to provide further information regarding the effective dates of JISC Rs that have been amended or adopted after May 15, 1976.

We seek to amend JISCR 18 to update terminology.

We request these changes to modernize the JISC Rs to the current organizational and technological court environment.

D. Hearing: A hearing is not requested.

E. Expedited Consideration: Expedited consideration is not requested.

Judicial Information Systems Committee Rules**JISCR 1****JUDICIAL INFORMATION SYSTEM**

It is the intent of the Supreme Court that a statewide Judicial Information System be developed. The Judicial Information System is to be designed and operated by the Administrator for Administrative Office of the Courts under the direction of the Judicial Information System Committee and with the approval of the Supreme Court pursuant to RCW 2.56. The Judicial Information System is to serve the courts of the state of Washington.

JISCR 2**COMPOSITION**

(a) Membership. The Judicial Information System Committee (JISC) shall be appointed by the Chief Justice. The Chief Justice will consider for appointment those individuals who have been suggested by representative groups and associations from within the judicial system but shall not be bound thereby. In addition, the Chief Justice shall consider for appointment only those individuals who have demonstrated an interest and commitment to judicial administration and to automation of judicial systems and functions. The committee shall be composed of four members from the appellate court level (Supreme Court and Court of Appeals), five members from the superior court level, two of whom shall be members of the Superior Court Judges' Association, and one of whom shall be a member of the Washington Association of Juvenile Court Administrators, five members from the courts of limited jurisdiction level, one of whom shall be a member of the Misdemeanant Corrections Probation Association, and three at large members from outside the judiciary, one of whom will be a member of the Washington State Bar Association, one of whom will be a member of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs, and one of whom will be a member of the Washington State Association of Prosecuting Attorneys.

(b) Terms of Office. The term of membership for those who are appointed to represent specific organizations shall be for a term of 3 years with the initial term as determined by lot, staggered so as to ~~insure~~ ensure that an equal number of terms expire each year. Any vacancy in the membership of the committee shall be filled in the same manner in which the original appointment was made and the term of membership shall expire on the same date as the original appointment expiration date.

(c) Operation. The Supreme Court Justice shall be the chairperson. The members of the committee shall elect a vice-chairperson from among themselves. Meetings of the committee shall be called regularly and at a minimum of four times per year at the discretion of the chair. Any members with two unexcused absences from regularly scheduled JISC meetings during any calendar year shall be requested to resign and the respective association shall appoint a successor to fulfill the unexpired term. User advisory committees shall be established for each level of court and will be representative of the users at each level. Ad hoc committees shall also be established for the purpose of monitoring specific projects undertaken by the Judicial Information System.

(a) Application. This rule applies to all requests for ~~computer-based~~ electronic court information submitted by an individual, as well as public and private associations and agencies. This rule does not apply to requests initiated by or with the consent of the Administrator for the Courts for the purpose of answering a request vital to the internal business of the courts.

(b) Excluded Information. Records sealed, exempted, or otherwise restricted by law or court rule may not be released to the general public except by court order.

~~**(c) Data Dissemination Committee.** [Rescinded.]~~

(dc) Data Dissemination Policies and Procedures. The Administrator for Administrative Office of the Courts shall promulgate policies and procedures for handling applications for ~~computer-based~~ electronic information. These policies and procedures shall be subject to the approval of the Judicial Information System Committee.

(ed) Information for Release of Data. Information which must be supplied by the requestor and upon which evaluation will be made includes:

- (1) Requestor's identifying information concerning the applicant;
- (2) Statement of the intended use and distribution;
- (3) Type of information needed.

(fe) Criteria To Determine Release of Data. The criteria against which the applications are evaluated are as follows:

- (1) Availability of data;
- (2) Specificity of the request;
- (3) Potential for infringement of personal privacy created by release of the information requested;
- (4) Potential disruption to the internal, ongoing business of the courts.

(gf) Cost. The requestor shall bear the cost of honoring the request for information in accordance with section ~~(dc)~~.

Information System Committee shall review and act upon the appeal in accordance with procedures promulgated by the Committee for this purpose.

C. Purpose:

The primary purpose of the suggested amendments to General Rule (GR) 24 (b) (6) is to reflect changes in Washington statutory law regarding assistance provided to individuals seeking protection orders.

The Practice of Law Board (POLB) is a Washington Supreme Court-created board governed by GR 25. Among the Board's responsibilities includes receiving and reviewing complaints alleging the unauthorized practice of law and referring complaints that allege harm to the public interest to appropriate enforcement agencies. GR 25 (b) (3).

GR 24(a) defines the practice of law, and GR 24(b) provides a list of its exceptions and exclusions stating certain activities are permitted whether or not they constitute the practice of law. Given its role reviewing complaints, the POLB regularly reviews the definition of the practice of law and its exceptions. Among the GR 24(b) exceptions is "[p]roviding assistance to another to complete a form provided by a court for protection under RCW chapters 10.14 (harassment) or 26.50 (domestic violence prevention) when no fee is charged to do so." GR 24 (b) (6).

On July 1, 2022, changes in Washington law took effect repealing RCW 10.14 and RCW 26.50, which broadly speaking, governed harassment and domestic violence proceedings, and replaced them with new RCW 7.105, Civil Protection Orders.¹ The new statute governs procedures for domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, vulnerable adult, extreme risk, and antiharassment protection orders.² New RCW 7.105 was enacted to "moderniz[e], harmoniz[e], and improv[e] the efficacy and accessibility of laws concerning civil protection orders."³ Among the goals of new RCW 7.105 include to "make the system less complex [and] provide sufficient victim support, consistency, safety, timeliness, and procedural fairness."⁴

New RCW 7.105 authorizes certain individuals who are not authorized to practice law to provide assistance in civil protection matters, namely court clerks,⁵ courthouse facilitators,⁶ sexual assault advocates,⁷ domestic violence advocates,⁸ protection order advocates,⁹ and support persons.¹⁰ A general description of the permissible activities under RCW 7.105 is attached as Appendix A.

Given the repeal of RCW 10.14 and RCW 26.50, the POLB suggests amendments to GR 24 (b) (6) to bring it into alignment with these statutory changes. Given the stated goals and purposes of RCW 7.105, the POLB is recommending to the Court that it adopt a slightly broader exception to the rule to (1) apply to all types of RCW 7.105 civil protection order matters and (2) cover the assistance permitted under the statute by any person authorized to do so under the statute. The suggested amendment would therefore expand the scope of civil protection orders to which the GR 24 (b) (6) exception applies and the pool of individuals who may assist those seeking protection orders.

APPENDIX A TO GR 9 COVER SHEET: GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF PERMISSIBLE ACTIVITIES UNDER RCW 7.105

RCW 7.105.120(1): Court Clerks and Court[house] Facilitators

RCW 7.105.120 provides statutory exemptions to court clerks and courthouse facilitators.¹ Under the statute, court clerks must "make available the standardized forms, instructions, and informational brochures required by this chapter, and shall keep current specific program names and telephone numbers for community resources, including civil legal aid and volunteer lawyer programs." RCW 7.105.120(1). The statute specifically exempts as not constituting the practice of law: "Any assistance or information provided by clerks under this chapter, or any assistance or information provided by any person, including court clerks, employees of the department of social and health services, and other court facilitators, to complete the forms provided by the court." *Id.*

RCW 7.150.250(1) Sexual Assault or Domestic Violence Advocates

RCW 7.105.250(1) authorizes sexual assault advocates² and domestic violence advocates³ "to accompany the petitioner, or appear remotely with the petitioner, and confer⁴ with the petitioner during court proceedings." However, the advocate "shall not provide legal representation." *Id.* Advocates may speak to the Court but are not required to beyond stating their role and organization. *Id.* Advocates "are not engaged in the unauthorized practice of law when providing assistance." *Id.*

RCW 7.105.250(2) Protection Order Advocates

RCW 7.105.250(2) authorizes protection order advocates⁵ "to accompany the petitioner to any legal proceeding including, but not limited to, sitting or standing next to the petitioner, appearing remotely with the petitioner, and conferring with the petitioner during court proceedings, or addressing the court when invited to do so." However, the advocate "shall not provide legal representation." RCW 7.105.250 (2) (b). Unless they seek to speak directly to the court, advocates are not required to identify themselves beyond stating their role and organization. RCW 7.105.250 (2) (c).

RCW 7.105.250(3) Support Persons

RCW 7.105.250(3) authorizes support persons⁶ "to accompany the petitioner to any legal proceeding including, but not limited to, sitting or standing next to the petitioner, appearing remotely with the petitioner, and conferring with the petitioner during court proceedings." However, the advocate "shall not provide legal representation." RCW 7.105.250 (3) (a).

¹ GR 24 (b)(10) exempts from the definition of the practice of law court clerks providing assistance as authorized by Supreme Court order, and GR 24 (b)(2) exempts courthouse facilitators providing assistance as authorized by court rule.

² "Sexual assault advocate" means the employee or volunteer from a community sexual assault program or underserved populations provider, victim assistance unit, program, or association, that provides information, medical or legal advocacy, counseling, or support to victims of sexual assault, who is designated by the victim to accompany the victim to the hospital or other health care facility and to proceedings concerning the alleged assault, including police and prosecution interviews and court proceedings." RCW 5.60.060 (7)(a); RCW 7.105.250(1).

³ "Domestic violence advocate" means an employee or supervised volunteer from a community-based domestic violence program or human services program that provides information, advocacy, counseling, crisis intervention, emergency shelter, or support to victims of domestic violence and who is not employed by, or under the direct supervision of, a law enforcement agency, a prosecutor's office, or the child protective services section of the department of children, youth, and families as defined in RCW 26.44.020." RCW 5.60.060 (8)(a); RCW 7.105.250(1). Confer is undefined in the statute.

F. Supporting Material: Suggested rule amendment.

Introduction

The King County Department of Public Defense and the Snohomish County Public Defenders Association propose changes to CrR/CrRLJ 4.1 to reduce the timeline for in-custody Arraignment Hearings from 14 days to 3 days.

In addition, these organizations proposed changes to CrRLJ 3.2.1 to both ensure that a preliminary hearing occurs within 48 hours and

to also ensure that a felony complaint is filed in Superior Court within three days of a felony probable cause finding in District Court.

By changing the timelines, incarcerated individuals will more quickly have an Arraignment hearing where they can both enter a plea and address conditions of release, including bail.

Background and justification for the proposal

In theory, those who are detained pretrial have an opportunity to be released at their preliminary court hearing. However, those hearings happen quickly and without full discovery. In addition, there are times when a person allegedly 'refuses' their preliminary appearance hearing and so do not have a hearing before their Arraignment hearing. As a result, individuals are frequently incarcerated in jail on unaffordable bail until their Arraignment Hearing. For example, King County jail data (as of 9/26/24) shows that of the releases in the last 14 days, 13.7% of people had been incarcerated for 4-10 days and 16.4% for 11-30 days.¹

Throughout Washington State, counties and cities schedule arraignment hearings for incarcerated people on different timelines. For example, in Pierce County, a person is generally arraigned on felony charges within 24 hours of booking but it can be up to 72 hours of booking.

In Snohomish County, felony complaints are regularly first filed in District Court and then filed into Superior Court two Fridays later; the District Court felony complaint hold (on unaffordable bail) is generally about 14 days, with variation to account for the second Friday filing deadline. After the State files a felony complaint into Superior Court, the accused individual has an Arraignment Hearing within 3 days. Snohomish County engages in this practice routinely- in 2023, Snohomish County filed 2,729 felony complaints into district court in 2023 and statewide, 3,705 were filed total.² The practice results in many accused persons sitting in jail due to the District Court hold (on unaffordable bail) and there is no access to discovery, speedy trial, or other rights provided for by Superior Court rules.

State v. Dowdney illustrates the practice well. In that case, Mr. Dowdney was booked into Snohomish County jail on March 11, 2016. On March 13, a district court commissioner ex parte found probable cause and set bail at \$500,000. In addition, the district court further ordered that, 'if a Complaint is filed in District Court-Everett Division by 5:00 p.m. on March 15, 2016, the conditions of release including bail shall remain in effect until the Felony Dismissal Date as listed on the Complaint.'

On March 14, Dowdney appeared before the district court, where the judge maintained the bail amount and conditions of release ...

The next day, March 15, the State filed a felony criminal complaint in district court, with a felony dismissal date of April 1. Dowdney was not arraigned at this or any point before a district court judge, nor did he have any type of preliminary hearing pursuant to CrRLJ 3.2.1 (g)(1). **It is undisputed that this practice regularly occurs in Snohomish County.**

On April 1, the State filed a new felony information in superior court, in which Dowdney was charged only with First Degree Robbery, and the district court charges were dismissed.

On April 4, Dowdney appeared before a Snohomish County Superior Court judge for arraignment ... 26 Wash. App. 2d 1002, review denied, 537 P.3d 1026 (Wash. 2023) (emphasis added).

The Court of Appeals, in an unpublished decision, analyzed the above practice and related objections and found that "without any comment as to the wisdom of this practice as a matter of policy, we conclude that the county's charging practice does not violate the equal protection clause as presented and argued in this particular case." Id.

As the above fact pattern demonstrates, Snohomish County's regular practice results in presumptively innocent people being booked into jail and then not coming to court for an Arraignment hearing for up to 24 days (in the above example, the arrest occurred on 3/11/16 and the Arraignment Hearing occurred on 4/4/24).

Similarly, in King County Superior Court, due to the timelines in CrR 4.1, incarcerated individuals generally languish in jail for 14 days after charges are filed before their Arraignment Hearing. That is even true for individuals who are arrested pursuant to a warrant and who do not have a preliminary appearance following their booking into jail.

Here are some examples of how presumptively innocent people languished in jail for weeks in King County before their arraignment hearings in September 2024:

■ 24-1-06228-5 -- a person was booked for possession with intent to manufacture on 9/4/24 and he did not have a preliminary appearance due to an alleged refusal. Charges were filed on 9/9/24 with a warrant issued on 9/9/24 for \$25,000. The arraignment hearing was set for 9/23/24, and the accused was released on personal recognizance with a less restrictive alternative 19 days after arrest.

■ 24-1-02843-5 -- a person was booked for residential burglary and criminal impersonation in the first degree on 9/3/24 with a warrant issued on 9/6/24 for \$10,000 (the amount ordered at the preliminary appearance) after the case was filed. The arraignment hearing was set for 9/19/24, where enhanced alternative CCAP programming was ordered, and the person was released 16 days after arrest.

■ 24-1-06419-9 -- a person was booked for motor vehicle theft on 9/1/24 and a warrant was issued on 9/5/22 for \$5,000 (the amount ordered at the preliminary appearance) after the case was filed. The arraignment hearing was set for 9/19/24, where the person was released on personal recognizance with basic alternative CCAP programming ordered, and the person was released 18 days after arrest.

■ 24-1-04295-1 -- a person was suspected of forgery on June 1, 2023, and was stopped and released by police. Over a year later, on 5/21/24 a single forgery charge was filed, and a notice of arraignment was sent to the person's old address, and the notice was returned as 'unclaimed mail'. On 6/3/24, a bench warrant was issued, and bail was set at \$5,050. The person was booked on 9/16/24. The arraignment hearing was set for 9/30/24, where the person was released on personal recognizance 14 days after being jailed.

States with shorter timelines between a person's booking into jail and their Arraignment hearing include Oregon, where an incarcerated person's arraignment is held within the first 36 hours of custody (excluding weekends and holidays). Or. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 135.010. In New Hampshire, incarcerated people's arraignments are held within 24-36 hours of arrest (excluding weekends and holidays). In New York State, a "delay of arraignment of more than 24 hours is presumptively unnecessary and, unless explained, constitutes a violation of CPL 140.20(1)," entitling the incarcerated person to immediate release. If the person is held on a felony complaint and cannot pay the bail set

at arraignment, the State has six days to indict them or else they get released. N.Y. Crim. Proc. Law § 180.80.

The proposed changes to CrR/CrRLJ 4.1 will ensure that an incarcerated person timely appears before the Court for their Arraignment Hearing so they may properly address release conditions, including bail, and so that the time for trial commences. Defense counsel cannot effectively address release conditions at a preliminary hearing because it is only after charges are filed that they can review the initial discovery in the case.

Similarly, the proposed changes to CrRLJ 3.2.1, will ensure that when a felony complaint is filed in District Court, that the preliminary hearing to determine probable cause will be held within 48 hours. In addition, the changes will ensure that if the court finds probable cause and binds the defendant over to the superior court, an information must be filed within 3 days to ensure that the defendant is not languishing in jail while waiting for charges to be filed.

Timely Arraignment hearings for incarcerated individuals help ensure that the accused is informed of the specific charges, can respond with a plea, and can address conditions of release. In addition, a timely Arraignment Hearing helps protect the right to speedy trial and prevents excessive delays since the timeline for a speedy trial starts at Arraignment.

The harms of pretrial incarceration are well known, with research demonstrating that that short periods of incarceration frequently up-end a person's employment, housing, child custody, and access to health care. See Lisa Foster, *Judicial Responsibility for Justice in Criminal Courts*, 46 Hofstra L. RevV. 21 (2018).

Timely arraignments (following timely filing of felony charges in Superior Court), where defense counsel can effectively address bail, are also important because studies demonstrate that both the imposition and effect of bail are racially disproportionate.³ Black defendants face higher bail amounts than white defendants charged with the same crimes.⁴ The racial disproportionality of the bail system has additional, far-reaching impacts due to the deleterious impact that pretrial incarceration has on case outcomes.⁵

Conclusion

Under these proposed amendments incarcerated individuals would have an Arraignment Hearing within three days of charges being filed and, moreover, felony charges would need to be filed in Superior Court within five days of a person's arrest.

Presumptively innocent people should not be forced to languish in jail for up to 14 days (if not longer, in Snohomish County) before defense counsel can address their release conditions from a discovery-informed perspective. Pretrial detention has a disproportionate racial impact and has life-changing effects on one's employment, housing, child custody, and access to health care. Ensuring timely arraignments

will help safeguard the accused's fundamental rights and reduce the excessive and harmful detention of individuals on unaffordable bail.

(1) *Defendant Detained in Jail.* The defendant shall be arraigned not later than ~~14~~ 3 days after the date the information or indictment is filed in the adult division of the superior court, if the defendant is (i) detained in the jail of the county where the charges are pending or (ii) subject to conditions of release imposed in connection with the same charges. At the time of the arraignment, the defendant shall have an opportunity to argue bail and other conditions of release pursuant to CrR 3.2.

**CrRLJ 4.1
ARRAIGNMENT**

(a) Time.

(1) Defendant Detained in Jail. The defendant shall be arraigned not later than ~~14~~ 3 days after the date the complaint or citation and notice is filed in court, if the defendant is (i) detained in a county or city jail in the county where the charges are pending, or (ii) subject to conditions of release imposed in connection with the same charges. At the time of the arraignment, the defendant shall have an opportunity to argue bail and other conditions of release pursuant to CrRLJ 3.2.

PROCEDURE FOLLOWING WARRANTLESS ARREST—PRELIMINARY HEARING

(g) Preliminary Hearing on Felony Complaint.

(1) When a felony complaint is filed, the court ~~may~~ must conduct a preliminary hearing within 48 hours to determine whether there is probable cause to believe that the accused has committed a felony unless an information or indictment is filed in superior court prior to the time set for the preliminary hearing. If the court finds probable cause, the court shall bind the defendant over to the superior court. If the court binds the accused over, or if the parties waive the preliminary hearing, an information shall be filed within 3 days ~~without unnecessary delay~~. Jurisdiction vests in the superior court at the time the information is filed.

(2) If at the time a felony complaint is filed with the district court the accused is detained in jail or subjected to conditions of release, the time from the filing of the complaint in district court to the filing of an information in superior court shall not exceed ~~30~~ 5 days plus any time which is the subject of a stipulation under subsection (g) (3). If at the time the complaint is filed with the district court the accused is not detained in jail or subjected to conditions of release, the time from the accused's first appearance in district court which next follows the filing of the complaint to the time

of the filing of an information in superior court shall not exceed 30 days, excluding any time which is the subject of a stipulation under subsection (g)(3). If the applicable time period specified above elapses and no information has been filed in superior court, the case shall be dismissed without prejudice.

(3) Before or after the preliminary hearing or a waiver thereof, the court may delay a preliminary hearing or defer a bind-over date if the parties stipulate in writing that the case shall remain in the court of limited jurisdiction for a specified time, which may be in addition to the 5 ~~30~~-day time limit established in subsection (g)(2).

C. Purpose

The proposed revision to CR 68 would clarify that the rule does not apply to actions under the Public Records Act, Chap. 42.56 RCW ("PRA"). The revision would reject the contrary interpretation of CR 68 by the Court of Appeals in Ruffin v. Seattle, 199 Wn. App. 348, 361-62, 398 P.3d 1237 (2017).

1. Background

CR 68 was adopted in 1967 for the purpose of encouraging settlement of civil claims for money or property. CR 68 allows a defendant to offer "money or property" to an adverse party at least 10 days before trial, and provides: "If the judgment finally obtained by the of-

feree is not more favorable than the offer, the offeree must pay the costs incurred after the making of the offer." The rule is intended to encourage settlement of disputes over money and property by making litigation riskier for plaintiffs.

The PRA did not exist at that time. Consequently, the consequences of applying CR 68 to the PRA were never considered by this Court.

The PRA was enacted by voter initiative in 1972. Laws 1973 c 1 (Initiative Measure No. 276, approved November 7, 1972). The PRA empowers superior courts to order agencies to produce public records and to order other injunctive relief to compel agencies to comply with the PRA. See *Resident Action Council v. Seattle Housing Authority*, 177 Wn.2d 417, 327 P.3d 600 (2013), amended (2014) (trial court ordered agency to produce properly redacted records in electronic format and to adopt new PRA procedures). The primary purpose of the PRA is **not** recovery of money or property, but rather "the preservation of the most central tenets of representative government, namely, the sovereignty of the people and the accountability to the people of public officials and institutions." *Progressive Animal Welfare Soc. v. Univ. of Washington*, 125 Wn.2d 243, 251, 884 P.2d 592, 597 (1994).

Although the PRA also provides for discretionary daily penalties for one type of PRA violation—wrongfully withholding records, RCW 42.56.550(4)—such penalties are **not** compensatory damages for the requestor, but are intended to deter PRA violations by agencies.¹ In *Yousoufian v. Office of Ron Sims*, 168 Wn.2d 444, 463-468, 229 P.3d 735 (2010), this court stated that a superior court's award of penalties should be based on consideration of various policy factors, including but not limited to the agency's bad faith and/or the need to deter future violations.

This Court further held that PRA penalties are not compensatory damages, and that personal economic loss to the requestor is irrelevant unless such losses were foreseeable to the agency. 168 Wn.2d at 461-462.

In 2017 the Court of Appeals, Division I, concluded for the first time that CR 68 should apply to PRA cases. *Rufin v. Seattle*, 199 Wn. App. 348, 361-62. In *Rufin* the King County Superior Court ruled that CR 68 was incompatible with the PRA, and that application of CR 68 in PRA cases would:

undermine the statutory purpose of the PRA to limit Plaintiff's recovery of costs and attorney fees. The purpose of the PRA is to protect the sovereignty of the people of this State. RCW 42.56.020. To assure that the public interest will be fully protected, the PRA is a strongly worded mandate for broad disclosure of public records and should be liberally construed to promote full access to public records, and its exemptions are to be narrowly construed. ... Application of CR 68 in this context would have a chilling effect on this public policy.

199 Wn. App. at 354. The superior court was correct.

Without inviting amicus briefing, three judges of Division One of the Court of Appeals reversed, concluding that CR 68 should apply to the PRA:

Applying CR 68 to the PRA is a reflection of this reasonableness requirement: if a plaintiff fails to improve her position at trial, the costs and attorney fees associated with the additional litigation are not reasonable, and may be limited pursuant to CR 68. The reasonableness requirement inherent in CR 68 is not in conflict with the PRA provision that the prevailing party "shall be awarded all costs, in-

cluding reasonable attorney fees, incurred in connection with such legal action." RCW 42.56.550(4) ...

Rufin also argues that the trial court correctly reasoned that applying CR 68 would have a chilling effect on actions to access public records. The City argues that CR 68 is good public policy because it promotes the settlement of PRA disputes. In spite of concerns about a chilling effect on litigation brought in the public interest, courts have nevertheless applied CR 68 to other remedial statutes such as the Consumer Protection Act, chapter 19.86 RCW, and the WLAD. The public policy goal of encouraging settlement of lawsuits is equally applicable to the disputes under the PRA.

Rufin argues that CR 68 would discourage an individual from bringing a claim for a PRA violation that does not support a free-standing penalty because in such a case, a plaintiff can be a prevailing party but not improve her financial position at trial. This may be so, but CR 68 is nonetheless an appropriate tool for resolving such violations of the PRA. It does not discourage a citizen from bringing an enforcement action. It promotes reasonable, prompt, and proportional resolution of PRA violations. [citations omitted]

199 Wn. App. at 362-363 (2017). As explained further below, the Court of Appeals did **not** consider the actual consequences of applying CR 68 to the PRA, nor explain how CR 68 could apply in PRA actions primarily seeking access to public records. Contrary to *Rufin*, CR 68 directly conflicts with the PRA in several ways. In addition, actual experience with applying CR 68 to the PRA has shown that CR 68 thwarts transparency.

¹ From 1992 to 2005, a minimum penalty of \$5 per day was mandatory. Laws of 1992, ch. 139, § 8. But in 2005, the legislature amended the PRA such that penalty range is \$0 to \$100 per day. Laws of 2011, ch. 273, § 1; RCW 42.56.550(4).

2. CR 68 conflicts with the proper enforcement of the PRA.

The PRA is a transparency statute, and the purpose of PRA litigation is to force agencies to comply with that statute in the public interest. PRA cases are **not** tort cases for damages. The discretionary daily penalties authorized by RCW 42.56.550(4) are **not** compensatory damages.

The legislature's elimination of mandatory minimum penalties in 2011 demonstrates that PRA cases are **not** about PRA penalties. Furthermore, PRA penalties are only available for one type of PRA violation: wrongful withholding of records. RCW 42.56.550(4). Agencies may be held liable for a number of other PRA violations, including improper PRA procedures and inadequate exemption logs, and superior courts may order injunctive relief under the PRA.

CR 68 distorts PRA litigation and thwarts the policy of the PRA by forcing trial courts to focus not on the enforcement of the PRA, but on the impossible task of determining whether a finding of liability and any other nonmonetary relief is worth as much or more to the requestor (not the public) than the agency's offer of taxpayer money to the requestor without any judicial determination of liability.

An agency may not use a CR 68 offer to avoid complying with the PRA because a court cannot place a dollar value on the disclosure (or nondisclosure) of particular records or PRA compliance generally. *Rufin* enables agencies to conceal PRA violations and withhold public records because a CR 68 offer of judgment must be accepted in just ten (10) days, and, if accepted, results in the dismissal of the case. *Rufin* did not consider this problem because *Rufin* only involved a comparison between the CR 68 offer and the penalty actually awarded by the superior court **after** the agency had complied with the PRA.

CR 68 also interferes with the ability of trial courts to impose additional injunctive relief on agencies by ordering changes in agency procedures. See *Resident Action Council*, 177 Wn.2d at 446-447 (upholding trial court order to produce electronic records and adopt new PRA procedures). In such cases, CR 68 would require a superior court to place a dollar value on the injunctive relief to the requestor in order to determine whether the requestor has improved their position after rejecting a CR 68 offer. Attempts to place a dollar value on PRA compliance is neither practical nor consistent with the policy of the PRA.

CR 68 offers of judgment discourage requestors from seeking injunctive relief that would otherwise be in the public interest. CR 68 incentivizes requestors to focus on obtaining the largest possible PRA penalty award in order avoid the negative effect of CR 68 on their recovery of attorney's fees. CR 68 offers of judgment thus have the anti-transparent effect of turning lawsuits about PRA compliance into lawsuits about PRA penalties.

Even where an agency has fully complied with the PRA **before** an offer of judgment is made, applying CR 68 conflicts with the policy of the PRA. According to *Rufin*, a judicial determination that the City of Seattle violated the PRA had no value, and the requestor should have accepted the City's no-fault offer of judgment, which was larger than the judgment actually entered by the trial court after finding the City liable. According to *Rufin*, public policy favored allowing the City of Seattle to pay off the requestor under CR 68 in order to avoid actually being held publicly accountable for wrongful withholding of records.

The proposed revision to CR 68 would promote the policy of the PRA, which favors holding agencies accountable in order to deter future violations. A PRA litigants' acceptance of a CR 68 offer of judgment is **not** an adequate substitute for a judicial determination that an agency has in fact violated the PRA. Contrary to *Rufin*, a judicial determination that a government agency has violated the PRA has significant intangible public value.

CR 68 was intended to settle private civil cases by giving litigants an incentive to be reasonable in their assessments of liability and/or damages. That rule is based on an underlying public policy assumption that attorney's fees and scarce judicial resources should not be expended on otherwise unnecessary and expensive determinations of private fault or precise determinations of private compensatory damages. These considerations are **not** applicable to PRA cases.

First, the litigation-reducing value of CR 68 is largely absent in PRA cases. There are no compensatory damages in PRA cases. A PRA penalty award does not require a jury or any sort of trial, evidence may be submitted in declarations, and no live witnesses are necessary. Trial courts exercise their broad discretion to determine penalties under the *Yousoufian* factors based on whatever information the parties provide, and their decisions are deferentially reviewed on appeal under the abuse of discretion standard.

Second, the Court of Appeals assumed that PRA litigants are able to make reasonable estimates of a trial court's likely penalty award, and that a requestor should be punished with reduced recovery of costs and/or attorney's fees under CR 68 for guessing wrong. Given the numerous *Yousoufian* factors and the enormous discretion of trial courts to determine penalties, PRA penalty awards and the fact patterns on which they are based are all over the map. There is no basis for *Rufin's* erroneous underlying assumption that PRA litigants can make rea-

sonable estimates of likely penalty awards for purposes of making or accepting offers of judgment under CR 68.

CR 68 is also based on the assumption that private litigants can be expected to be reasonable **with their own money**. That assumption is **not** valid in PRA cases where at-fault elected officials and/or their attorneys can use CR 68 offers of judgment—to be paid with the taxpayers money—to conceal their own mistakes or bad faith. Experience has demonstrated that agencies and their attorneys have repeatedly misused CR 68 offers of judgment to pay off requestors in PRA cases that they have mishandled or over-litigated. By offering the requester a few thousand dollars to go away without a finding of liability, an agency and its attorney can blame the PRA while avoiding any scrutiny of the agency's bad PRA violations and/or litigious behavior.

The applications of CR 68 to PRA cases has allowed numerous agencies and agency attorneys to conceal their lack of PRA compliance, their wrongful withholding of records, their lack of proper training or rules, and their excessive litigation tactics. Agencies may make several offers of judgment over the course of a PRA case, gradually increasing the amount offered until requestor finally decides to accept an offer and dismiss the case.

When a CR 68 offer is accepted, there is no judicial determination of fault. Each time a requestor accepts a CR 68 offer of judgment the policy of the PRA is thwarted. Each time an agency uses CR 68 to terminate a PRA case the agency has effectively used taxpayer dollars to:

- purchase the ability to deny violating the PRA and blame the requestor and/or PRA, regardless of how bad the agency's conduct actually was;
- prevent any inquiry into why the agency violated the PRA and/or whether particular public officials or attorneys should be held accountable for the PRA violations;
- eliminate any possibility that a superior court might impose injunctive relief requiring the agency to obtain additional training or adopt new PRA procedures; and
- prevent any inquiry into whether agency attorneys have actually increased their agency's PRA liability by going into "litigation mode" rather than acting in the public interest by bringing their agencies into PRA compliance.

Since *Rufin*, numerous agencies and their attorneys have used CR 68 offers of judgment to conceal PRA violations and to avoid being held accountable.

CR 68 directly conflicts with the policy of the PRA in numerous ways, and the misuse of CR 68 offers of judgment by agencies has harmed the goals of the PRA. This Court should amend CR 68 to state that the rule does not apply to actions under the PRA.

D. Hearing Requested

A hearing is requested.

E. Expedited Consideration

Expedited consideration is requested as the next scheduled review of the Civil Rules is several years away.

CR 68 OFFER OF JUDGMENT

(a) At any time more than 10 days before the trial begins, a party defending against a claim may serve upon the adverse party an offer to allow judgment to be taken against the defending party for the money or property or to the effect specified in the defending party's offer, with costs then accrued. If within 10 days after the service of the offer the adverse party serves written notice that the offer is accepted, either party may then file the offer and notice of acceptance together with proof of service thereof and thereupon the court shall enter judgment. An offer not accepted shall be deemed withdrawn and evidence thereof is not admissible except in a proceeding to determine costs. If the judgment finally obtained by the offeree is not more favorable than the offer, the offeree must pay the costs incurred after the making of the offer. The fact that an offer is made but not accepted does not preclude a subsequent offer. When the liability of one party to another has been determined by verdict or order or judgment, but the amount or extent of the liability remains to be determined by further proceedings, the party adjudged liable may make an offer of judgment, which shall have the same effect as an offer made before trial if it is served within a reasonable time not less than 10 days prior to the commencement of hearings to determine the amount or extent of liability.

(b) This rule does not apply to actions under the Public Records Act, Chap. 42.56 RCW.

3. Purpose

The 2023-2024 Courthouse Facilitator Advisory Committee makes this proposal for various reasons, the key points are to 1) update law changes, 2) include accessibility language, and 3) change all references from "pro se" to "self-represented persons".

First, to update law changes specifically, RCW 11.88 and RCW 11.92 have been removed from the Rule, by reference. Protection Orders have been added by reference because some counties' Facilitators assist with this case type. Other updates made are to refer to "Court-house Facilitator" as a consistent title, with proper capitalization throughout. The "definitions" section has been alphabetized to improve organization as well as explained in further detail while capturing the essence of the current Rule.

Second, the current Rule has limited language about the Court-house Facilitator's role to provide accessibility help. The Advisory Committee wanted to elaborate on what that help should entail and refer to GR 33 to capture the full extent of ADA Accommodations. Our hope is other committees will take notice and make similar recommendations for Rule changes.

Third, we changed all "pro se" references to "self-represented person". With the help of the Administrative Office of the Court's Court Equity and Access Program, it was decided the Latin term for those without an attorney causes confusion to those whom it describes. "Self-represented person" was the alternative we selected and have updated GR 27 to reflect the change in language.

4. Is a Public Hearing Recommended?

The 2023-2024 Courthouse Facilitator Advisory Committee does not believe a Public Hearing is needed.

5. Is Expedited Consideration Requested?

The 2023-2024 Courthouse Facilitator Advisory Committee does not believe expedited consideration is needed.

C. Court Procedures: Assisting self-represented persons to identify and understand how basic court rules, procedures, and logistics apply to their cases, including how to comply with requirements for starting the case, when and how to file and serve motions and other necessary documents, scheduling hearings, authenticating and presenting documents, preserving and appealing decisions, discovery rules and options, obtaining and enforcing judgements or other final orders (including trial setting and related rules) and other procedures relevant to their cases.

C. Purpose: Empower a judge to dismiss a case in the furtherance of justice by modifying CrR 8.3b to include factors for the Court to consider.

D. Public Hearing: A public hearing is not recommended.

E. Expedited Consideration: Expedited consideration is not requested.

Introduction

The proposed amendment to CrR 8.3 and CrRLJ 8.3, Dismissal, aims to ensure that judges throughout Washington are empowered to dismiss cases in the furtherance of justice. Moreover, the proposed amendment includes factors for the trial court to consider when making a decision whether to dismiss a case due to prosecutorial misconduct or mismanagement.

For too long, Washington courts have been constrained by the Washington State Supreme Court's unduly narrow interpretation of CrR 8.3(b) in *State v. Starrish*. The Court should now amend CrR 8.3(b) to allow for trial courts to dismiss an action in the "furtherance of justice" and recognize, in the words of Justice Utter in his dissent, that courts are not simply "passive instruments of prosecutorial policies." *State v. Starrish*, 86 Wn.2d 200, 214, 544 P.2d 1 (1975).

A broader dismissal rule will ensure that "the broad discretion of prosecutors and the rigidity of aggravated sentencing laws will not combine to reduce judges to the status of mere clerks assigned to stamp and file the decisions of other agencies of government." *Id.* As Justice Utter warned, CrR 8.3(b) "is too important to be so tightly confined as the majority's decision renders it. It should be read as being as broad and flexible as the principles of justice to which it refers, and against which exercise of judicial power should always be measured." *Id.*

This Court can and should authorize courts to use CrR/CrRLJ 8.3(b) as it was intended and as the demands of justice require. In its June 4, 2020 letter to the legal community, the Court wrote that we:

continue to see racialized policing and the overrepresentation of black Americans in every stage of our criminal and juvenile justice systems. The legal community must recognize that we all bear responsibility for this on-going injustice, and that we are capable of taking steps to address it, if only we have the courage and the will.

The Court should act to amend CrR/CrRLJ 8.3 to ensure that the court can act in the "furtherance of justice" and consider specific factors when evaluating whether to dismiss a case due to prosecutorial mismanagement or misconduct.

Other jurisdictions have court rules allowing dismissal in "the furtherance of justice."

Other jurisdictions provide judges with greater discretion to dismiss a criminal case in the furtherance of justice. These dismissal authorities vary in terms of procedural details - such as whether they require a motion from the defense, a written entry as to reason into the record, or notice to all parties - but they all allow for broader discretion than Washington for courts to dismiss charges. One court examined similar rules across the country and explicitly rejected Washington's narrow approach to CrR 8.3, describing it as "[p]erhaps the most limited application" among the states. See *State v. Brumage*, 435 N.W. 2d 337, 340 (Iowa 1989).

In Idaho, Criminal Rule 48 allows -

a) Dismissal on Motion and Notice. The court, on notice to all parties, may dismiss a criminal action on its own motion or on motion of any party on either of the following grounds:

(1) for unnecessary delay in presenting the charge to the grand jury or if an information is not filed within the time period prescribed by Rule 7(f), or for unnecessary delay in bringing the defendant to trial, or

(2) for any other reason if the court concludes that dismissal will serve the ends of justice and the effective administration of the court's business.

(emphasis added).

In Ohio, Criminal Rule 48(B) provides that: "[i]f the court over objection of the state dismisses an indictment, information, or complaint, it shall state on the record its findings of fact and reasons for the dismissal." The Ohio Supreme Court has held that the rule

"does not limit the reasons for which a trial judge might dismiss a case, and we are convinced that a judge may dismiss a case pursuant to Crim.R. 48(B) if a dismissal serves the interests of justice." *State v. Busch*, 76 Ohio St.3d at 615 (1996). In Iowa, trial courts are vested with authority to dismiss criminal charges under Rule of Criminal Procedure 27(1), which provides:

The court, upon its own motion or the application of the prosecuting attorney, in the furtherance of justice, may order the dismissal of any pending criminal prosecution, the reasons therefor being stated in the order and entered of record, and no such prosecution shall be discontinued or abandoned in any other manner. Such a dismissal is a bar to another prosecution for the same offense if it is a simple or serious misdemeanor; but it is not a bar if the offense charged be a felony or an aggravated misdemeanor.

The Iowa Supreme court interpreted this rule in *State v. Brumage*, 435 N.W.2d 337, 339-41 (Iowa 1989), and found that "[a] trial court's authority to dismiss under Rule 27(1) is limited by the general phrase 'in the furtherance of justice'... We hold that our trial court should dismiss only after considering the substantive rights of the defendant and the interests of the state."

In New York State, Criminal Procedure Law Section 170.40 delineates a number of factors for the Court to consider in evaluating whether to dismiss a case "in the interest of justice" due to "some compelling factor, consideration or circumstance clearly demonstrating that conviction or prosecution of the defendant upon such accusatory instrument or count would constitute or result in injustice." The trial court is required to consider the following factors:

- (a) the seriousness and circumstances of the offense;
- (b) the extent of harm caused by the offense;
- (c) the evidence of guilt, whether admissible or inadmissible at trial;
- (d) the history, character and condition of the defendant;
- (e) any exceptionally serious misconduct of law enforcement personnel in the investigation, arrest and prosecution of the defendant;
- (f) the purpose and effect of imposing upon the defendant a sentence authorized for the offense;
- (g) the impact of a dismissal on the safety or welfare of the community;
- (h) the impact of a dismissal upon the confidence of the public in the criminal justice system;
- (i) where the court deems it appropriate, the attitude of the complainant or victim with respect to the motion;
- (j) any other relevant fact indicating that a judgment of conviction would serve no useful purpose.

Considering these factors (understanding that New York's rule relates to dismissal in the "interests of justice" rather than "arbitrary action or governmental misconduct") along with the practice in other states, Washington state judges should consider the following factors when deciding motions made pursuant to CrR 8.3(b)/CrRLJ 8.3(b):

- (1) the seriousness and circumstances of the offense;
- (2) the impact of a dismissal on the safety or welfare of the community (the defendant is part of the community);

This ETA provides guidance on the application of state and local use tax on self-produced fuels. In addition, this ETA addresses the application of business and occupation (B&O) tax on the production of self-produced fuels.

The department is updating this ETA to incorporate the value of refinery fuel gas for quarter 1, 2025. The value of refinery fuel gas is based on the average of the most recent 36 months of the "Henry Hub" natural gas spot prices, as published by the federal Energy Information Administration. The 36-month average value is calculated and published by the department on a quarterly basis. See RCW 82.12.0203.

This memo serves as notice that the Washington medical commission (commission) is rescinding POL2021-02 Telemedicine, which was filed December 12, 2021, and published under WSR 22-01-092.

The purpose of this policy statement was to provide guidance to allopathic physicians and physician assistants who use telemedicine to provide medical services to Washington patients.

The commission is rescinding this policy statement because the state of Washington became the first state to enact ESSB 5481, the Uniform Telemedicine Act, and this statute just recently went into effect on June 6, 2024.
