
SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1304

1 AN ACT Relating to recycling in state parks, marinas, and airports;
2 adding new sections to chapter 70.93 RCW; and making appropriations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.93 RCW
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) By July 1, 1992, the state parks and recreation commission
7 shall provide waste reduction and recycling information in each state
8 park campground and day-use area.

9 (2) By July 1, 1993, the commission shall provide recycling
10 receptacles in the day-use and campground areas of at least fifteen
11 state parks. The receptacles shall be clearly marked for the disposal
12 of at least two of the following recyclable materials: Aluminum,
13 glass, newspaper, plastic, and tin. The commission shall endeavor to
14 provide recycling receptacles in parks that are near urban centers or
15 in heavily used parks.

1 (3) The commission shall provide daily maintenance of such
2 receptacles from April through September of each year.

3 (4) Beginning July 1, 1993, the commission shall provide recycling
4 receptacles in at least five additional state parks per biennium until
5 the total number of state parks having recycling receptacles reaches
6 forty.

7 (5) The commission is authorized to enter into agreements with any
8 person, company, or nonprofit organization to provide for the
9 collection and transport of recyclable materials and related activities
10 under this section.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 70.93 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 (1) Each marina with thirty or more slips and each airport
14 providing regularly scheduled commercial passenger service shall
15 provide adequate recycling receptacles on, or adjacent to, its
16 facility. The receptacles shall be clearly marked for the disposal of
17 at least two of the following recyclable materials: Aluminum, glass,
18 newspaper, plastic, and tin.

19 (2) Marinas and airports subject to this section shall not be
20 required to provide recycling receptacles until the city or county in
21 which it is located adopts a waste reduction and recycling element of
22 a solid waste management plan pursuant to RCW 70.95.090.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** (1) The sum of twenty-five thousand
24 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from
25 the litter control account to the state parks and recreation commission
26 for the purposes of section 1 of this act for the biennium ending June
27 30, 1993.

1 (2) The sum of twenty thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may
2 be necessary, is appropriated from the trust land purchase account to
3 the state parks and recreation commission for the purposes of section
4 1 of this act for the biennium ending June 30, 1993.
