- 1 AN ACT Relating to school-aged child care programs; and creating
- 2 new sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that a large proportion of school-aged children in the state of Washington are not
- 6 under the care and supervision of an adult before and after school and
- 7 during school vacations while their parents work or are engaged in
- 8 educational programs. As a result, the health, safety, and well-being
- 9 of these children are at considerable risk during these hours. The
- 10 legislature recognizes the need to encourage and facilitate the
- 11 development of school-aged child care programs throughout the state for
- 12 the benefit of the state's families. The legislature, therefore,
- 13 intends to develop a plan for a state-wide system of school-aged child
- 14 care programs.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The child care coordinating committee
- 16 established under RCW 74.13.090 shall develop a plan for a state-wide
- 17 system of school-aged child care programs. The child care coordinating
- 18 committee shall ensure the involvement of school-aged child care

- 1 providers, either public or private, or both, including those who are
- 2 not current members of the child care coordinating committee, in the
- 3 development of the plan. The plan must include, but is not limited to:
- 4 (1) A statement of the current need for before-and-after school and 5 school vacation care programs in this state;
- 6 (2) Identification of the children that should be targeted for 7 school-aged child care programs;
- 8 (3) How local communities can involve parents and interested groups 9 in identifying and addressing local needs for school-aged child care 10 programs;
- 11 (4) Standards for quality programming during the hours of operation 12 of school-aged child care;
- 13 (5) Recommendations for school-aged child care health and safety 14 standards;
- 15 (6) Recommendations for the administration of the programs, 16 including transportation if recommendations include off-site care 17 programs;
- 18 (7) Recommendations regarding funding and parent-pay policies; and
- 19 (8) Recommendations on the policy and role of the state in school-20 aged child care programs.
- 21 The child care coordinating committee shall submit its plan to the 22 appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1, 1993.
