- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29.36.013 and 1991 c 81 s 30 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 Any ((disabled)) voter ((or any voter over the age of sixty-five))
- 7 may apply, in writing, for status as an ongoing absentee voter. Each
- 8 ((such voter shall be granted that status by his or her county auditor
- 9 and)) qualified applicant shall automatically receive an absentee
- 10 ballot for each ensuing election for which he or she is entitled to
- 11 vote and need not submit a separate request for each election. Ballots
- 12 received from ongoing absentee voters shall be validated, processed,
- 13 and tabulated in the same manner as other absentee ballots.
- 14 Status as an ongoing absentee voter shall be terminated upon any of
