- 1 AN ACT Relating to impersonation of a law enforcement officer;
- 2 amending RCW 9A.60.040; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.60.040 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 260 s 9A.60.040 are 5 each amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) A person is guilty of criminal impersonation in the first 7 degree if ((he)) the person:
- 8 (a) Assumes a false identity and does an act in his <u>or her</u> assumed 9 character with intent to defraud another or for any other unlawful
- 10 purpose; or
- 11 (b) Pretends to be a representative of some person or organization
- 12 or a public servant and does an act in his or her pretended capacity
- 13 with intent to defraud another or for any other unlawful purpose.
- 14 (2) Criminal impersonation <u>in the first degree</u> is a gross
- 15 misdemeanor.
- 16 (3) A person is guilty of criminal impersonation in the second
- 17 <u>degree if the person:</u>
- 18 (a) Claims to be a law enforcement officer or creates an impression
- 19 that he or she is a law enforcement officer; and

- 1 (b) Under circumstances not amounting to criminal impersonation in
- 2 the first degree, does an act with intent to convey the impression that
- 3 he or she is acting in an official capacity and a reasonable person
- 4 would believe the person is a law enforcement officer.
- 5 (4) Criminal impersonation in the second degree is a misdemeanor.
