1 AN ACT Relating to the sale of port property; and amending RCW 2 53.08.090.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 53.08.090 and 1981 c 262 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) A port commission may, by resolution, authorize the managing 6 7 official of a port district to sell and convey port district property of ((less than twenty-five hundred)) <u>ten thousand</u> dollars <u>or less</u> in 8 9 value. ((Such)) The authority shall be in force for not more than one 10 calendar year from the date of resolution and may be renewed from year to year. Prior to any such sale or conveyance the managing official 11 12 shall itemize and list the property to be sold and make written 13 certification to the commission that the listed property is no longer needed for district purposes. Any large block of ((such)) the property 14 15 having a value in excess of ((twenty-five hundred)) ten thousand dollars shall not be broken down into components of ((less than twenty-16 17 five hundred)) ten thousand dollars or less value and sold in ((such)) the smaller components unless ((such)) the smaller components be sold 18 19 by public competitive bid. A port district may sell and convey any of

its real or personal property valued at more than ((twenty-five 1 hundred)) ten thousand dollars when the port commission has, by 2 resolution, declared the property to be no longer needed for district 3 purposes, but no property which is a part of the comprehensive plan of 4 improvement or modification thereof shall be disposed of until the 5 comprehensive plan has been modified to find ((such)) the property 6 7 surplus to port needs. The comprehensive plan shall be modified only 8 after public notice and hearing provided by RCW 53.20.010.

9 Nothing in this section shall be deemed to repeal or modify 10 procedures for property sales within industrial development districts 11 as set forth in chapter 53.25 RCW.

12 (2) The ten thousand dollar figures in subsection (1) of this 13 section shall be adjusted annually based upon the governmental price

14 index established by the department of revenue under RCW 82.14.200.
