1 AN ACT Relating to tuition; and reenacting and amending RCW
2 28B.15.202, 28B.15.402, and 28B.15.502.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.202 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 8 and 1993 c 379 s
5 202 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

6 Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at the
7 University of Washington and at Washington State University for other
8 than the summer term shall be as follows:

9 (1) For full-time resident undergraduate students and all other
10 full-time resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled
11 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
12 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition
13 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be thirty-six and three-tenths
14 percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be forty-one and one-
15 tenth percent of the per student undergraduate educational costs at the
16 state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
17 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
18 shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96
19 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a

1 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
2 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
3 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
4 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
5 year the total tuition fees for a full-time resident undergraduate
6 student shall be no more than two thousand eight hundred twenty
7 dollars, and for the 1996-97 academic year the total tuition fees for
8 a full-time resident undergraduate student shall be no more than two
9 thousand nine hundred seventy-nine dollars.

10 (2) For full-time resident graduate and law students not enrolled
11 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
12 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition
13 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and two-tenths
14 percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-eight and
15 four-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at
16 the state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
17 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
18 shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96
19 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
20 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
21 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
22 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
23 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
24 year the total tuition fees for full-time resident graduate and law
25 students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of
26 medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine
27 shall be no more than four thousand seven hundred fifty-eight dollars,
28 and for the 1996-97 academic year the total tuition fees for full-time
29 resident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to
30 the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor
31 of veterinary medicine shall be no more than five thousand one hundred
32 ninety-nine dollars.

33 (3) For full-time resident students enrolled in programs leading to
34 the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor
35 of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one hundred
36 sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (2) of this
37 section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year shall
38 be three hundred and forty-two dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96
39 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a

1 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
2 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
3 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
4 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
5 year the total tuition fees for full-time resident students enrolled in
6 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
7 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, shall be no more than seven
8 thousand nine hundred thirty-eight dollars. For the 1996-97 academic
9 year the total tuition fees for full-time resident students enrolled in
10 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
11 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine shall be no more than eight
12 thousand six hundred seventy dollars.

13 (4) For full-time nonresident undergraduate students and such other
14 full-time nonresident students not in graduate study programs or
15 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,
16 doctor of dental surgery, or doctor of veterinary medicine, the total
17 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be one hundred nine
18 and three-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be one
19 hundred twenty-two and nine-tenths percent of the per student
20 undergraduate educational costs at the state universities computed as
21 provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building
22 fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and fifty-four
23 dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for
24 each academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This
25 percentage shall be calculated by the higher education coordinating
26 board and be based on the actual percentage the building fee is of
27 total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest
28 half percent. For the 1995-96 academic year the total tuition fees for
29 a full-time nonresident undergraduate student shall be no more than
30 eight thousand seven hundred fifty-four dollars, and for the 1996-97
31 academic year the total tuition fees for a full-time nonresident
32 undergraduate student shall be no more than nine thousand five hundred
33 sixty-one dollars.

34 (5) For full-time nonresident graduate and law students not
35 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,
36 doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total
37 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be sixty-five and six-
38 tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be seventy-three
39 and six-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at

1 the state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
2 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
3 shall be three hundred and fifty-four dollars. Beginning with the
4 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be
5 a percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be
6 calculated by the higher education coordinating board and be based on
7 the actual percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-
8 95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the
9 1995-96 academic year the total tuition fees for full-time nonresident
10 graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the
11 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
12 veterinary medicine shall be no more than twelve thousand three hundred
13 fifteen dollars, and for the 1996-97 academic year the total tuition
14 fees for full-time nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled
15 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
16 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine shall be no more than
17 thirteen thousand four hundred forty-three dollars.

18 (6) For full-time nonresident students enrolled in programs leading
19 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and
20 doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one
21 hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (5) of
22 this section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
23 shall be five hundred and fifty-five dollars. Beginning with the 1995-
24 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
25 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
26 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
27 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
28 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
29 year the total tuition fees for full-time nonresident students enrolled
30 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
31 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine shall be no more than
32 twenty thousand five hundred fifty-nine dollars. For the 1996-97
33 academic year the total tuition fees for full-time nonresident students
34 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,
35 doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine shall be no
36 more than twenty-two thousand four hundred thirty-seven dollars.

37 (7) The governing boards of the state universities shall charge to
38 and collect from each student, a services and activities fee. The
39 governing board may increase the existing fee annually, consistent with

1 budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not
2 to exceed the annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate
3 tuition fees: PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply
4 to that portion of the services and activities fee previously committed
5 to the repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic year,
6 services and activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-three
7 dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic year, services and
8 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-nine dollars per
9 student. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW
10 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee
11 increase.

12 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.402 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 11 and 1993 c 379 s
13 203 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

14 Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at the
15 regional universities and The Evergreen State College for other than
16 the summer term shall be as follows:

17 (1) For full-time resident undergraduate students and all other
18 full-time resident students not in graduate study programs, the total
19 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-seven and
20 seven-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be thirty-
21 one and five-tenths percent of the per student undergraduate
22 educational costs at the regional universities computed as provided in
23 RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for
24 each academic year shall be seventy-six dollars and fifty cents.
25 Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each
26 academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This
27 percentage shall be calculated by the higher education coordinating
28 board and be based on the actual percentage the building fee is of
29 total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest
30 half percent. For the 1995-96 academic year the total tuition fees for
31 a full-time resident undergraduate student shall be no more than two
32 thousand eighty-five dollars, and for the 1996-97 academic year the
33 total tuition fees for a full-time resident undergraduate student shall
34 be no more than two thousand two hundred five dollars.

35 (2) For full-time resident graduate students, the total tuition
36 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and three-
37 tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-eight
38 and six-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at

1 the regional universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
2 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
3 shall be seventy-six dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-
4 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
5 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
6 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
7 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
8 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
9 year the total tuition fees for a full-time resident graduate student
10 shall be no more than three thousand six hundred fifty-four dollars,
11 and for the 1996-97 academic year the total tuition fees for a full-
12 time resident graduate student shall be no more than three thousand
13 nine hundred ninety-six dollars.

14 (3) For full-time nonresident undergraduate students and all other
15 full-time nonresident students not in graduate study programs, the
16 total tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be one hundred
17 nine and four-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be
18 one hundred twenty-three percent of the per student undergraduate
19 educational costs at the regional universities computed as provided in
20 RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for
21 each academic year shall be two hundred and ninety-five dollars and
22 fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee
23 for each academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees.
24 This percentage shall be calculated by the higher education
25 coordinating board and be based on the actual percentage the building
26 fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded up to the
27 nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic year the total tuition
28 fees for a full-time nonresident undergraduate student shall be no more
29 than eight thousand four hundred sixty-three dollars, and for the 1996-
30 97 academic year the total tuition fees for a full-time nonresident
31 undergraduate student shall be no more than nine thousand two hundred
32 forty-three dollars.

33 (4) For full-time nonresident graduate students, the total tuition
34 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be eighty-two percent and
35 thereafter total tuition fees shall be ninety-two percent of the per
36 student graduate educational costs at the regional universities
37 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That
38 the building fees for each academic year shall be two hundred and
39 ninety-five dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-96

1 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
2 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
3 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
4 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
5 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
6 year the total tuition fees for a full-time nonresident graduate
7 student shall be no more than eleven thousand seven hundred twenty-four
8 dollars, and for the 1996-97 academic year the total tuition fees for
9 a full-time nonresident graduate student shall be no more than twelve
10 thousand seven hundred ninety-eight dollars.

11 (5) The governing boards of each of the regional universities and
12 The Evergreen State College shall charge to and collect from each
13 student, a services and activities fee. The governing board may
14 increase the existing fee annually, consistent with budgeting
15 procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not to exceed
16 the annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition fees:
17 PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply to that portion
18 of the services and activities fee previously committed to the
19 repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic year, services and
20 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred ((~~eight-four~~ [eighty-
21 ~~four~~]) eighty-four dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic
22 year, services and activities fees shall not exceed two hundred ninety
23 dollars per student. The services and activities fee committee
24 provided for in RCW 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing
25 board for a fee increase.

26 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.15.502 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 12 and 1993 c 379 s
27 204 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

28 Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at each
29 community college for other than the summer term shall be set by the
30 state board for community and technical colleges as follows:

31 (1) For full-time resident students, the total tuition fees for the
32 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and four-tenths percent and
33 thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-eight and eight-tenths
34 percent of the per student educational costs at the community colleges
35 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That
36 the building fees for each academic year shall be one hundred and
37 twenty-seven dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-96
38 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a

1 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
2 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
3 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
4 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the 1995-96 academic
5 year the total tuition fees for a full-time resident student shall be
6 no more than one thousand two hundred thirty-six dollars, and for the
7 1996-97 academic year the total tuition fees for a full-time resident
8 student shall be no more than one thousand three hundred five dollars.

9 (2) For full-time nonresident students, the total tuition fees for
10 the 1993-94 academic year shall be one hundred nine and three-tenths
11 percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be one hundred twenty-
12 two and seven-tenths percent of the per student educational costs at
13 the community colleges computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
14 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
15 shall be four hundred and three dollars and fifty cents. Beginning
16 with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each academic year
17 shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be
18 calculated by the higher education coordinating board and be based on
19 the actual percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-
20 95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent. For the
21 1995-96 academic year the total tuition fees for a full-time
22 nonresident student shall be no more than five thousand four hundred
23 sixty-three dollars, and for the 1996-97 academic year the total
24 tuition fees for a full-time resident student shall be no more than
25 five thousand nine hundred sixty-four dollars.

26 (3) The governing boards of each of the state community colleges
27 shall charge to and collect from each student a services and activities
28 fee. Each governing board may increase the existing fee annually,
29 consistent with budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a
30 percentage not to exceed the annual percentage increase in resident
31 student tuition fees: PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall
32 not apply to that portion of the services and activities fee previously
33 committed to the repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic
34 year, services and activities fees shall not exceed one hundred twenty-
35 eight dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic year, services and
36 activities fees shall not exceed one hundred thirty-one dollars per
37 student. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW
38 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee
39 increase.

1 (4) Tuition and services and activities fees consistent with
2 subsection (3) of this section shall be set by the state board for
3 community and technical colleges for summer school students unless the
4 community college charges fees in accordance with RCW 28B.15.515.

5 Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, each governing board
6 may charge such fees for ungraded courses, noncredit courses, community
7 services courses, and self-supporting courses as it, in its discretion,
8 may determine, consistent with the rules and regulations of the state
9 board for community and technical colleges.
