**SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1325**

---

**State of Washington****54th Legislature****1995 Regular Session**

1       AN ACT Relating to tuition for students in programs leading to the  
2 degree of doctor of pharmacy; reenacting and amending RCW 28B.15.202;  
3 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5       **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.202 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 8 and 1993 c 379 s  
6 202 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

7       Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at the  
8 University of Washington and at Washington State University for other  
9 than the summer term shall be as follows:

10       (1) For full-time resident undergraduate students and all other  
11 full-time resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled  
12 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of  
13 dental surgery, doctor of pharmacy, and doctor of veterinary medicine,  
14 the total tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be thirty-  
15 six and three-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be  
16 forty-one and one-tenth percent of the per student undergraduate  
17 educational costs at the state universities computed as provided in RCW  
18 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each  
19 academic year shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with

1 the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall  
2 be a percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be  
3 calculated by the higher education coordinating board and be based on  
4 the actual percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-  
5 95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

6 (2) For full-time resident graduate and law students and students  
7 enrolled in programs leading to the degree of doctor of pharmacy, not  
8 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,  
9 doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total  
10 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and  
11 two-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-  
12 eight and four-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational  
13 costs at the state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067  
14 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic  
15 year shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with the 1995-  
16 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a  
17 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated  
18 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual  
19 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic  
20 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

21 (3) For full-time resident students enrolled in programs leading to  
22 the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor  
23 of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one hundred  
24 sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (2) of this  
25 section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year shall  
26 be three hundred and forty-two dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96  
27 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a  
28 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated  
29 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual  
30 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic  
31 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

32 (4) For full-time nonresident undergraduate students and such other  
33 full-time nonresident students not in graduate study programs or  
34 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,  
35 doctor of dental surgery, doctor of pharmacy, or doctor of veterinary  
36 medicine, the total tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be  
37 one hundred nine and three-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition  
38 fees shall be one hundred twenty-two and nine-tenths percent of the per  
39 student undergraduate educational costs at the state universities

1 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That  
2 the building fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and  
3 fifty-four dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the  
4 building fee for each academic year shall be a percentage of total  
5 tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated by the higher  
6 education coordinating board and be based on the actual percentage the  
7 building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded  
8 up to the nearest half percent.

9 (5) For full-time nonresident graduate and law students and  
10 students enrolled in programs leading to the degree of doctor of  
11 pharmacy, not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of  
12 medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine,  
13 the total tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be sixty-  
14 five and six-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be  
15 seventy-three and six-tenths percent of the per student graduate  
16 educational costs at the state universities computed as provided in RCW  
17 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each  
18 academic year shall be three hundred and fifty-four dollars. Beginning  
19 with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each academic year  
20 shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be  
21 calculated by the higher education coordinating board and be based on  
22 the actual percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-  
23 95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

24 (6) For full-time nonresident students enrolled in programs leading  
25 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and  
26 doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one  
27 hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (5) of  
28 this section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year  
29 shall be five hundred and fifty-five dollars. Beginning with the 1995-  
30 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a  
31 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated  
32 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual  
33 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic  
34 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

35 (7) The governing boards of the state universities shall charge to  
36 and collect from each student, a services and activities fee. The  
37 governing board may increase the existing fee annually, consistent with  
38 budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not  
39 to exceed the annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate

1 tuition fees: PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply  
2 to that portion of the services and activities fee previously committed  
3 to the repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic year,  
4 services and activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-three  
5 dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic year, services and  
6 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-nine dollars per  
7 student. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW  
8 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee  
9 increase.

10        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 2.**    This act is necessary for the immediate  
11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
12 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take  
13 effect July 1, 1995.
