- 1 AN ACT Relating to storage of public records on compact discs; and
- 2 amending RCW 40.14.010.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 40.14.010 and 1982 c 36 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 As used in this chapter, the term "public records" shall include
- 7 any paper, correspondence, completed form, bound record book,
- 8 photograph, film, sound recording, map drawing, machine-readable
- 9 material, compact disc meeting current industry ISO specifications, or
- 10 other document, regardless of physical form or characteristics, and
- 11 including such copies thereof, that have been made by or received by
- 12 any agency of the state of Washington in connection with the
- 13 transaction of public business, and legislative records as described in
- 14 RCW 40.14.100.
- 15 For the purposes of this chapter, public records shall be
- 16 classified as follows:
- 17 (1) Official public records shall include all original vouchers,
- 18 receipts, and other documents necessary to isolate and prove the
- 19 validity of every transaction relating to the receipt, use, and

- disposition of all public property and public income from all sources 1 whatsoever; all agreements and contracts to which the state of 2 Washington or any agency thereof may be a party; all fidelity, surety, 3 4 and performance bonds; all claims filed against the state of Washington or any agency thereof; all records or documents required by law to be 5 filed with or kept by any agency of the state of Washington; all 6 legislative records as defined in RCW 40.14.100; and all other 7 8 documents or records determined by the records committee, created in 9 RCW 40.14.050, to be official public records.
- 10 (2) Office files and memoranda include such records correspondence, exhibits, drawings, maps, completed forms, or documents 11 not above defined and classified as official public records; duplicate 12 copies of official public records filed with any agency of the state of 13 Washington; documents and reports made for the internal administration 14 15 of the office to which they pertain but not required by law to be filed 16 or kept with such agency; and other documents or records as determined 17 by the records committee to be office files and memoranda.
