1 AN ACT Relating to claims for damages caused by deer or elk;
2 creating new sections; and providing an expiration date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Claims exceeding two thousand dollars that
5 have been filed pursuant to RCW 77.12.280(1) and that have been
6 submitted to the legislature pursuant to RCW 4.92.040(5) may be paid as
7 submitted by the risk management office. Payment shall be made by the
8 department from moneys appropriated for that purpose.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The house of representatives and the senate
10 committees on natural resources, together with the department of fish
11 and wildlife, shall study the issue of damages caused by wildlife and
12 develop long-term policy proposals regarding state compensation to be
13 made for such damages. These proposals shall be submitted by December
14 1, 1995.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act shall expire on January 1, 1996.
